# Cookham Resurrection sets record on paper for Spencer

'Resurrection' scenes by Stanley Spencer (1891-1959) hold a special place in the artist's canon. These portrayals of the village of Cookham as a setting for miracles and divine intervention were a key part of his oeuvre. Today, they are also venerated commercially.

A relatively modestly scaled work from 1920-21 drew dramatic competition at Roseberys in south London last week. The oil and pencil on paper laid down on board titled *The Resurrection, Cookham* was offered at a 127-lot sale conducted for the descendants of the family that ran the dealership Arthur Tooth & Sons.

Measuring 12 x 17in (31 x 44cm) and estimated at £100,000-150,000, it attracted bids from six phone lines and the internet. It was eventually knocked down at £320,000 and is now heading to a private collection.

# LAPADA fair cancelled over rising costs

Previously held in a purpose-built marquee in Berkeley Square every autumn, the trade association's showpiece fair has not taken place since 2019 because of coronavirus restrictions. However, a significant rise in costs was cited by the LAPADA board as the reason for scrapping of this year's event.

With buyer's premium added, it made £396,500.

The price set an auction record for a work on paper by the artist, surpassing David And Bathsheba, a pen, ink, charcoal drawing from c.1912 that made £110,000 at Sotheby's in June 2011.

The subject of the work sold in West Norwood on February 21 relates to Spencer's belief, as a devout Christian, in a joyful day of resurrection where everyone, including his friends and 'loves', would be raised from the dead to receive God's grace or judgment.

In a precursor to his monumental painting also called *The Resurrection, Cookham* from 1924-7 (now in Tate Britain), this colourful but loosely handled picture

shows figures uprooting their headstones as they emerge from the grave.

The subject matter was bolstered by its provenance and exhibition history. The work was originally owned by artist Henry Lamb, a friend and patron of Spencer. The pair met in 1913 and both artists served in the medical corps during the First World War. Spencer later painted the Tate's painting in Lamb's studio which may explain how he came to own the current work.

Arthur Tooth acquired the picture directly from Lamb's wife and it remained with Dudley Tooth, who ran the gallery in London's Haymarket from the mid-1920s, before passing to his descendants when he died in 1972.

In terms of its exhibition history, it had featured in the

two most important Spencer shows of recent times – the exhibition at the Royal Academy in 1980 and another at Tate in 2001.

Overall, Roseberys' auction was a white glove affair, raising a premium-inclusive total of close to £1m.

Among other lots dramatically exceeding estimate was Augustus John's (1878-1961) *Dorelia in the Garden* from 1912, an early work showing the artist's common-law wife and most famous sitter Dorelia McNeill in bohemian garb (she often wore homemade clothes as the couple travelled across southern England in a Gypsy caravan).

The 20 x 12in (51 x 30 cm) oil on board flew passed a £12,000-18,000 estimate and took £148,000, the third

highest price for the artist at auction according to Artprice. The sum was shy however of the £160,000 for a smaller drawing of Dorelia in a hat which sold at Christie's in December 2013.

The sale also included a group of eight Paul Nash (1889-1946) watercolours – part of Dudley Tooth's personal collection rather than the gallery's stock. Pitched at attractive levels, they all sold above estimate for a £127,500 combined total with the auction house reporting trade, private collectors and institutional buying.

The highest price among the Nash pictures was the £27,000 bid for *Moonrise Over Stow-on-the Wold* from 1945 which overshot a £6000-8000 estimate

## Supports builds for Baggott's ivory antiques rescue scheme

The Antiques Rescue Centre (ARC), an initiative started by dealer Michael Baggott, has attracted support from a number of auction houses and members of the trade.

Baggott has created the ARC (see ATG 2530) for objects that are at risk of being destroyed when the Ivory Act comes into force later this year.

He said: "Ideally we will receive nothing as everyone will want to treasure that item and keep it: that's the best outcome.

"But the reality is lots of people want to clear out items that they may inherit.

The ARC is the last resort: an alternative to the bin, the shredder or the scrap man's hammer."

Among the auction houses that have volunteered to accept items from the public who would instead throw them away, are Ryedale, Trevanion, Cooper and Tanner and Golding Young & Mawer's Bourne saleroom. These auction houses will accept items on behalf of the ARC.

A number of volunteers within the trade have also offered to collect items.

Baggott plans to create a register of the items donated and, if a location to store the items as part of a public display is not found, the ARC will publish the images of the collection online and create a catalogue.

He added: "The more specialists that volunteer within the trade the better but this is a slow process and ARC will develop over time.

"No one person will own the items - they will form a small national collection of things saved from destruction.

"The plan is for the items to be shared, not stored away without access. If the collection builds, ARC will eventually become a charity or trust."

Baggott is also asking for photos of items that are being modified for sale with ivory elements (finials, escutcheons, handles etc) removed and replaced. He said these images can be

sent anonymously.

## Art gallery wants your Egyptian revival expertise

Norwich's Sainsbury Centre art gallery has put a call out to the art and antiques sector for information and objects to help develop a new show.

The gallery will host an exhibition exploring the "enduring influence of ancient Egypt on visual culture" and would like to hear from people with Egyptian revival objects as well as information about

makers and manufacturers.

Visions of Ancient Egypt is planned to coincide with two anniversaries of Egyptology in 2022: the centenary of the rediscovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and the bicentenary of Champollion's decipherment of hieroglyphs.

The show will explore how ancient Egypt has "shaped centuries of global art and design, charting how its iconic imagery has been re-imagined by different cultures for different purposes over time".

The curators plan to include 200 fine and decorative works of art – from Egyptian antiquities and Roman sculpture to Orientalist paintings – for the exhibition which is planned to run at Sainsbury Centre for Visual

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

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## Harris calls it a day at '84 and a half' LAPADA fair future

Dealer and BBC Antiques Roadshow veteran Ian Harris is auctioning the majority of his stock at Stride & Son as the company N Bloom & Son closes after more than a century.

The sale in Chichester on March 3 features just over 200 pieces of Harris' jewellery stock, including many signed pieces. Much of it he bought before shutting the doors to his final 'bricks and mortar' shop in 2005.

N Bloom & Son was opened by Nathan Bloom (Harris' grandfather) in 1912.

Harris joined the firm in 1953 at age 16, taking over completely in 1971. Initially the dealership focused on silver, but after a few months at its first shop in Albemarle Street, London, Harris suggested adding jewellery to the

window to attract lady customers. It soon became the leading part of the business.

Over the years the shop moved to Bond Street, Conduit Street, Bond Street Antiques Arcade and eventually to a small shop in the Piccadilly Arcade which closed in 2005. He continued to deal online.

Harris is a familiar face from BBC's Antiques Roadshow, which he joined at the beginning in 1979, and he has since been part of a Roadshow team on lecture cruises around the world.

"I decided it was time to cash it in," Harris said. "I am 84 and a half and it's time to call it a day."

## Plea to find stolen prop jewels of The Crown

The antiques trade is being asked to look out for a group of props stolen from the team behind Netflix's *The Crown* that were taken from a lorry.

Around 350 items were taken from a lorry park in Mexborough, near Rotherham, on February 16 while filming was taking place nearby.

The theft was reported to South Yorkshire police and there is hope that some of the items can be recovered.

Alison Harvey, series set

decorator for season five of *The Crown*, said: "The items stolen are not necessarily in the best condition and therefore of limited value for resale. However, they are valuable as pieces to the UK film industry."

Among the missing items was a replica of the Fabergé 1897 Imperial Coronation coach egg. Also stolen were 12 silver candelabra and seven gilt candelabra, the clock face of a William IV longcase (leaving the longcase behind), a quantity of

Russian icons, a 10 piece silver dressing table set and St Louis allt glassware and decanters.

It is believed to date to c.1500 and is both the largest and one of the most technically sophisticated examples of a bronze roundel known from the early Renaissance.

The Met has acquired it from a UK dealer for £20.4m (including VAT)

The roundel had previously sold at Christie's in December 2003 for £6.95m (including buyer's premium) and was owned by the buyer and their family until 2019 when it was sold to the

UK dealer who then sold it on to the Met on the provision an export licence was granted.

However, the export was temporarily stopped while the UK government sought a buyer to keep it in the UK (it had been in the UK since at least the early 18th century) and pay the £17m plus £3.4m VAT required (as reported in ATG No 2496).

No buyer came forward and at the

end of last year it was agreed it could be exported and the Met's acquisition was completed.

James David Draper (1943-2019), the Met's former curator emeritus of European sculpture, had attempted to buy the roundel for the museum in 2003, but another buyer was successful at the Christie's auction. At the time, Draper wrote: "This is the most thrilling Renaissance bronze to appear on the market in ages." He spent his 45-year career at The Met, building the collections of 15th and 16th century Italian and 18th and 19th century French sculpture before retiring in 2014.

The purchase of the roundel was made possible in major part through a bequest from Draper, as well as from Alejandro Santo Domingo and Michel David-Weill along with other trustees on the Met's acquisitions committee.

exhibitors would now need to pay a huge £900 per square metre of stand space for the show to break even.

She said: "I've been to every one of our suppliers from energy to plywood and costs have gone up in every case. It's beyond inflation – it's a combination of inflation, post-Brexit and post-pandemic costs. The cost of parking, insurance and stand building has gone up. Just building the toilets would cost 60% more than at our last fair."

For many years the LAPADA event was one of two major trade association events in London, with the *BADA Fair* taking place in the spring. Both are now doubtful.

The latter was sold and rebranded as *The Open Art Fair* for 2020. However, after its dramatic closure at the start of the first lockdown, it was subject to a series of legal disputes over stand payments.

#### **Appetite remains**

With many dealers now comfortable trading online, the question is whether such fairs would attract the requisite number of exhibitors.

According to Simms, however, there is still an appetite for these events. LAPADA included a survey with the announcement of its cancellation to gauge interest in other LAPADA-organised events. "We haven't had full results yet, but from what we can tell so far there is a desire for a LAPADA fair – and certainly a trade association fair – in London," she said.

While the association is currently between fair directors (former fair manager Sophie Wood is now director of the *Chelsea Antiques Fair*) Simms said there was "capacity" to plan and run a fair. She previously ran the *Art & Antiques Fair Olympia* and other team members have hands-on fair experience.

As LAPADA has tenancy in perpetuity of the Berkely square space, a return to the former site is not out of the question.

In the meantime, the trade body is pursuing new ways of helping members bring their stock to the market. It has planned to take part in *London Craft Week* (May 9-15) and increase its profile with *The Game Fair* (July 29-31), which it first partnered with last year.

LAPADA previously shared its marquee with *PAD London*, which confirmed that it will run from October 10-16 and told *ATG* that the "cancellation of the LAPADA fair will not impact on the fair taking place in Berkeley Square".

## Pioneering rail trio took a trip to the US

Sometimes it pays to look a little further afield.

Exactly how a contract uniting three pioneers of the British passenger railway system made its way to the US was unknown. But it came for sale at the Southport, Connecticut, saleroom of Roland & Co on February 12 from a vendor who had bought it at an RM Smythe auction in New York some years ago.

The auction house, which specialises in autographs, manuscripts and ephemera, thought it might be worth at least \$250-450 and it was right - it sold to a buyer from outside the US for \$15,000 (£11,500) plus buyer's premium.

In this handwritten legal document, of October 18, 1842, George Stephenson of Tapton House, Derbyshire agrees to put down a bond of £1000 to guarantee the faithful performance of the services of Mr John Dixon as the engineer and general manager of the Birmingham & Derby Junction Railway.

It is inscribed Signed sealed and delivered by the above named George Stephenson in the presence of Robert Stephenson Jnr, Tapton House.

While George and his son Robert, the men behind The Rocket, scarcely need an introduction, John Dixon (1796-1865) is a lesser-known but almost equally important name in the early history of the railways.

Born into a County Durham family of Quaker industrialists, he began his working life clerking for Jonathan Backhouse (1747-1826), the Darlington banker who helped finance the Stockton & Darlington Railway project. However, as George Stephenson's assistant, Dixon would prove himself a brilliant surveyor and civil engineer.

Following the opening of the S&DR, the world's first passenger railway using steam locomotives, in 1825 Dixon oversaw the surveying work on the Liverpool and Manchester line (the first public inter-city railway opened in 1830) and a succession of other projects in the 1830s-40s.

Businessmen in Birmingham, well served since the 18th century by an extensive canal network, began looking at the possibilities of the iron horse in the 1830s. With the support of Prime Minister Robert Peel, the MP for Tamworth, the Birmingham & Derby Junction Railway Bill passed through Parliament in 1836. Robert Stephenson took on the post of engineer to oversee the construction of 42 miles of track, 78

bridges, two viaducts and a cutting approaching Derby.

The B&DR opened on August 12, 1839, with Dixon assuming his role three years later. It appears he was in the post until 1845 when he returned to Darlington to work at the S&DR.

Roland & Co is the successor to RM Smythe & Co, a New York auction house established in 1880.

The book was one of the 500 produced in the first Potter book print run in 1997. It was ordered and purchased from Leatherhead Bookworm in Surrey by a collector and now retired paper merchant.

He said: "I bought that first issue of ...Philosopher's Stone because I noticed an advert for it in the Bookseller magazine which compared it to the

Famous Five novels and predicted it could be a prizewinner. I've really looked after it. It's in the best condition it possibly can be. It's never been read. Because the paper in the book is poor quality I was told to keep it away from sunlight to prevent it going brown."

The owner said that at first he thought his copy was not complete as it did not have a dust jacket (something that nearly led him to request a refund).

He added: "Eventually I realised a dust jacket was not specified. Now I've reached the time of life when it would be useful to pay off the mortgage I've decided to sell."

## Goalie shirt saved since 1879 single appearance

One of the earliest items of football memorabilia to appear at auction emerged at **Bonhams** in Knightsbridge on February 15: an England international goalkeeper shirt from 1879.

When it was worn by Rupert Darnley Anderson (1859-1944) on January 18 of that year, in a 2-1 win over Wales at The Oval in south London, he was just the ninth person to have played in goal

The game was also the first international friendly between England and Wales according to FA rules, with the Welsh goal being their first ever

Not only was it Anderson's only England appearance, it was also rather short: the match finished after only 60 minutes due to heavy snowfall, with two halves of 30 minutes played

The 38in chest woollen shirt was estimated at £2500-3500 in The Connoisseur's Library Sale. It made £14,000 (plus 25% buyer's premium). The shirt came to auction by descent.

Despite taking the England goalkeeper role, Anderson actually played as a striker for Old Etonians FC. However, he ended up missing their 1879 FA Cup triumph against Clapham Rovers because of injury. The first FA Cup had been contested just seven

During the the 1879 cup run, Darwen, beaten by OE in the fourth round, became one of the northern, more professional teams

to start challenging the gentlemen amateur, 'old boys' clubs, as football changed. Indeed, OE became the last club of that ilk to win the FA Cup,

A match programme for the 1882 final took a record £30,000 at Graham Budd's May 2013 auction and is now house at the Museum of Eton Life.



HG Beasley's collecting odyssey

Two Soloman Island clubs were catalyst to amassing of more than 10,000 artefacts

Harry Geoffrey Beasley (1881-1939), heir to the North Kent Brewery in Plumstead, developed an interest in ethnography at an early age.

A collecting obsession that began aged 13 with the acquisition of two Solomon Island clubs developed over a lifetime to number approximately 10,000 artefacts from all over the world. Until the building was bomb damaged, many pieces were displayed at the Cranmore Ethnographical Museum in Chislehurst.

Substantial portions of the collection, acquired during that inter-war golden age when London was awash with dealers, collectors and civil servants returning from the empire, were donated to other institutions.

The HG Beasley provenance is one attached to pieces in the British Museum, the Pitt-Rivers in Oxford and the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology in Cambridge. However, the remainder of the collection was retained by Beasley's widow Irene and his family.

A total of 15 pieces – four ivory brush pots and 11 rhinoceros horn libation cups – were offered as part of the inaugural sale at Alastair Gibson Auctions (25% buyer's premium) in London on November 18.

Some great rarities were available here, all dating to the late Ming and early Qing periods (17th and 18th centuries).

Estimated at £20,000-30,000 but sold at £40,500 was a finely carved 5in (13cm) wide 'Jian Guangzhi' vessel copying a Western Han jade 'ear' cup. One of only half a dozen recorded, it has an inscription dated to the Guiwei year (1643 or 1703) that reads: 'in the year of the Ram, stone fire, star fire, copy of Han dynasty jade Jianguang Zhi'.

An old paper collection label is dated June 20, 1930. Three signed examples are known by the famous Yangzhou carver Bao Tiancheng; including that from the Fowler Museum, Los Angeles, sold at Christie's in London in November 2006 for £100,000.

The sale and movement of rhinoceros horn works of art is quite properly subject to tight controls and it is fair to say that the family had left it relatively late in the day to decide to sell. Export licences are now only

granted to objects with a hammer price that exceeds \$100 per gram by weight and it had required some months working with the Covid-hit CITES team in Bristol before even a well-provenanced group such as this could be sold.

Another very rare form was a cup carved as a recumbent mountain goat – one of the animals of the Chinese zodiac and an auspicious creature often used as a symbol for the coming of spring. One of three other examples illustrated by Jan Chapman's *The Art of Rhinoceros Horn Carving in China* (1999) bears both a Wanli reign mark and a Bao Tiancheng seal mark, which helps date this group to c.1600.

This example was particularly well observed (the natural striations of the horn had been used by the carver to accentuate the fur of the animal). It took £31,000.

In total the Beasley lots (three were unsold) took £255,000. Most sold to Hong Kong and China.

#### Several hats worn

Gibson has seen the Asian art world from the perspective of both

poacher and gamekeeper. Head of Chinese and Japanese works of art at Sotheby's for many years, he became a dealer and consultant (to Canterbury Auction Galleries among others) in 2008. As the business continues to evolve, he now plans to return to the rostrum full time.

"This sale was primarily born out of lockdown boredom and the inability to do business in the traditional way at fairs during 2020 and 2021," he said. "But going forward I have decided to return to my former career as an auctioneer, primarily specialising in Chinese ceramics and works of art.

"Generally speaking, Asian clients prefer to transact via auction, and over the last two years all online auction formats have been thriving. I am currently working towards my next auction in early July."

The first sale, on view at the Brian Haughton gallery during November and sold from the Kerry Taylor Auctions premises in Bermondsey, south London, set the bar at a pretty high level.

The online catalogue was among the best published for the *Asian*

Art in London series, complete with scholarly references and detailed condition reports. The hammer total was £675,060 with a healthy 78% of the 234 lots sold. At a time when Sotheby's and Christie's are scaling back the London focus on Chinese art (Sotheby's will soon join Christie's in holding one sale in the capital with other event moving to Paris and Hong Kong) there is clearly some wiggle room in the market.

#### **Boston bonus**

Items from the estate of Diana Metcalf Stainow (1926-2019), a native of Boston who lived and worked as an artist in London, Paris and Hong Kong, were offered by Gibson without reserve.

Some raced away. From a group of classic-era ceramics (catalogued as 19th century copies by another auctioneer) were three Jianyao 'hare's fur' tea bowls from the Song or Jin period (12th or 13th century) estimated at £400-600 each. They sold for prices of £490, £2600 and £9000 – the last-mentioned for a bowl covered in a running russet and black glaze that fell just short of the foot, exposing the unglazed purplish-brown body.

A feature of the market in recent years has been the willingness to accept damage when it comes to Qing mark and period porcelain. Some good examples of this came for sale from a private source: all had been listed in an old inventory from 1967 (updated by Christie's in 1976).

An 8in (20cm) Yongzeng (1722-35) lotus-petal from bowl decorated with chrysanthemum sprays to a powder blue ground took £16,000 (estimate £2000-3000) despite having been broken in half. This rare type of decoration was created by blowing the cobalt pigment onto a stencil. An identical bowl in good condition sold at Sotheby's Hong Kong in April 2012

as part of the Meiyintang Collection for HK\$1.4m (£140,000).

Also Yongzeng mark and period (and also broken in seven pieces) was a green and brown yellow ground 'dragon' dish. Most pieces of this type from the Kangxi period have grapes to the border decoration but this one adopts the crane motif used on other Yongzheng yellow and green porcelain wares made for the Forbidden City. The hammer price was £6500 (estimate £400-600).

In better condition were a trio of pieces of Kangxi famille verte.

Two 5in (13cm) brush pots (bitong) had been bought from a Dutch private collection at Christie's Amsterdam in 2007. The example painted with two scholars in a classical landscape, a kingfisher perched on a spray of trailing peony and bamboo and two poems took £11,000 while another depicting a scholar offering a book to the poet Li Taibo and to the reverse with the Daoist god of literature Guixing brought £9000. The latter had a star crack to the base.

A 14in (35cm) famille verte dish decorated with a central image of a leaping carp in iron red and gilt sold at £13,000. The carp in Chinese mythology symbolises courage and perseverance; in the 'Dragon Gate' fable it swims up a waterfall where it is transformed into a benevolent and powerful dragon. This dish with a lozenge mark to the base had previously sold at Christie's New York in January 2014 for \$18,000.

An exceptional pair of large baluster vase and covers from c.1740 came for sale from a Portuguese private collection and had previously been with London export porcelain dealership Cohen & Cohen.

Finely painted in the famillerose palette with green peafowl, Manchurian cranes, paradise flycatchers and myna birds among luxuriant full-blown peony blooms, they stood 4ft 3in (1.28m) high on 18th century European carved giltwood stands. The epitome of English country house taste and in overall good condition (one with a recently restored hairline), these took £41,000 (estimate £40,000-60,000), the top bid of the sale.

Not forgetting the addition of

some good Japanese ceramics, a 10in (25cm) Meiji satsuma vase sold at £3200 (estimate £2000-3000).

Finely painted with a processional scene of high-ranking ladies, gentlemen and children enjoying the spring blossom, it has the artist's signature in iron-red and gilt, Okamoto Ryozan, for the Yasuda Company, Kyoto.

## 'Qianlong' objects inspired by China's archaic past

This blue and white ewer with a Qianlong mark offered at Cheffins (24.5% buyer's premium) in Cambridge as part of an Interiors sale on February 10 is of a type modelled on a Zhou bronze ritual wine vessel or he, writes Roland Arkell.

It is decorated with stylised lotus blossom and the *Bajixiang*, the eight Buddhist emblems in order: flaming wheel, conch shell, umbrella, canopy, lotus, vase, double fish and endless knot above lotus sprays.

Several examples with Qianlong (1730-96) seal marks have appeared for sale in London, New York and Hong Kong. Another of this design with a Qianlong seal mark is illustrated in *Porcelain of the National Palace Museum*, *Blue and White Ware of the Ch'ing Dynasty*.

Cheffins catalogued its ewer, with a break to the rim (two pieces broken and replaced) as a later copy but at

least some bidders begged to differ. It reached £23,000.

Vessels such as this were hugely popular in the Qing court where ancient objects were particularly revered. The Qianlong emperor himself exhorted his court and craftsmen to look to China's archaic past for moral guidance and artistic inspiration.

In particular, a large number of 18th century jades (and the many copies that followed) were inspired by the forms and designs of antiquity.

#### Sought-after vase

Some good examples were offered as a group by **Special Auction Services (20% buyer's premium)** of Newbury in the monthly Antiques &

Collectables sale staged on February I. Offered with only descriptive catalogue descriptions and modest guides, three lots took five-figure sums.

The Ilin (28cm) vase pictured here, in a pale green stone with russet inclusions assumed a flattened baluster form and is carved with a repeating pattern based on heavily stylised mythical beasts. To the base is a six-character Qianlong six-character fang gu mark – one that suggests the carving is 'imitating an old relic'. Clearly some bidders thought it was 18th century as bidding rose way past the estimate of £1000-1500 to bring £22,500.

Vases such as this are sometimes referred to as incense-tool vases as they would be used to contain the chopsticks and spatulas used in the preparation of incense for Buddhistic ceremonies

## Thrilled by the chase

Chinese export bowls such as this one, **right**, decorated in the mandarin palette with famille rose foxhunting scenes, were popular both with the British and American markets in the last quarter of the 18th century. Although the exact print source has not been identified (it may have been an adaptation or evolved after being recopied many times), it bears comparison with the works of artist James Seymour that were made popular by the London printmaker Thomas Burford.

A multitude of subtle variations on the theme are known with this particular bowl, measuring just over 18in (41cm) across, decorated with two large scenes of European huntsmen and hounds in a wooded landscape, two smaller cartouches of exotic birds and a medallion to the well depicting a figure holding a gun as his dogs flush out a pair of pheasants. The scenes were particularly well drawn and the bowl in reasonable condition apart from

At C&T (22% buyer's premium) in Kenardington, Kent, on February 8, it sold at £4000 (estimate £300-400).

## Creative cushion cover

Qing period embroidered satin throne-back cushion covers can be seen still in situ in a number of the buildings in the Forbidden City including the Hall of Supreme Principle and the Palace of Eternal Spring. Others are held by institutions and collectors throughout the world.

This example **above**, dated to the 18th century, was offered at **Canterbury Auction Galleries (27% buyer's premium inc VAT)** on February 5. Guided at £3000-5000, it took £26,000, selling to an online bidder from China.

The design in coloured silk and gold threads to the imperial yellow ground (now uniformly faded) includes nine dragons and clouds above the terrestrial diagram emerging from rolling waves. In a later mahogany frame measuring 2ft 8in x 3ft 1in (82 x 94cm), it was in decent condition save the loss of some of the gold threadwork. It came for sale from a west Kent vendor whose mother clearly had an eye for fine antiques.

The price was akin to that realised by other throne covers in recent years – the exception being the massive £193,000 bid at Christie's London in 2011 for a cover centred by a single large dragon clutching a shou character above his head. Dated c.1800, it was described by Christie's as among the finest examples known.

## Qing iron red 'reject' is £25,000 surprise

Leading the sale held by **Thomson Roddick (18% buyer's premium)** in Rosewell, Edinburgh, on February 10 was a 7in (18cm) high Qing iron red bottle decorated with chilong dragons amid stylised clouds. It had apparently been rejected by 'a more prestigious auctioneer'.

The auction house catalogued it as 19th century and was probably correct: if there had been a mark to the base it had removed when the base had been ground out. Estimated at £300-500, it sold at £25,000.

From a different source was a blue and white cylindrical form brush pot, 6½ in (16.5cm) high, painted with a narrative scene. It was dated to the '18th or 19th century' but more probably was from the Transitional or early Kangxi (1661-1722) period.

The composition probably relates to one of the Ming epics – the literary inspiration for many 'scholars' objects of the period. In good condition and sold with a carved hardwood stand, it was estimated at £150-200 but took £5000.

## Heaven and earth: toilet invention influences

During the Victorian era the Rev Henry Moule (1801-80) of Fordington in Dorset was doubtless considered something of a zealot.

Running his vicarage like a commune, complete with vegetable garden and livestock, in 1859 he invented the first composting toilet.

Moule (pronounced Mole) was conscious of the need to prevent the spread of disease, but he also disapproved of the water closet on theological grounds as he felt it polluted God's rivers and seas and was a waste of nutrients which should be returned to the soil.

More than a century ahead of his time, he published several works on this subject, the first being *Advantages of the Dry Earth System* in 1868, and set up the Moule Patent Earth Closet Co Ltd which manufactured and sold earth closets.

A sale of Rural and Domestic Bygones at Clarke & Simpson (18% buyer's premium) in Framlington, Suffolk, on February 5 featured one of his later patents: a 1873 version



with its mahogany box and cast-iron frame. Dry earth or peat is put into the hopper at the back of the seat and deposited via a lever into a bucket placed below. Estimated at £100-200, it took £320.

Moule's ideas did prove influential. In India, in particular, the system was used in many public buildings while in 1868 *The Lancet* reported that 148 of his dry earth closets were used

by 2000 men at an army volunteer camp in Wimbledon "without the slightest annoyance to sight or smell".

#### **Corking example**

The task of removing a cork from a bottle with minimum effort and distress was another that vexed many Victorian inventors and spawned numerous different patent designs based on simple mechanics. The model offered for sale at Laidlaw (18% buyer's premium) in Carlisle on February 5 with a guide of just £30-40, but sold at £1650, was marked No. 3167 and Patent GF Hipkins & Son Lever-Rack.

George Frederick Hipkins of Birmingham was the maker of steel eyebrow corkscrews and a number of other Victorian 'mechanical' corkscrews including the Lund's and the Hiram Codd patents but this model was patented by his son William Edward Hipkins in 1879. Composed of a framed rack with a central hinge, the cork is removed by a single concave lever.

The estimate was certainly modest for a corkscrew that has long been recognised among the most desirable Victorian patents.

The Hipkins is mentioned in both Mechanical Corkscrews: Their Evolution, Actions, And Patents (1999) by Ferd Peters and British Corkscrew Patents from 1795 (1997) by Fletcher Wallis, while other examples have sold at auction for £1500-3000 in the past decade.

## There really was trouble at mill

The third and final part of the collection of 19th century silver trade tokens formed by John Akins was offered by **Dix Noonan Webb (24% buyer's premium)** in London as part of its February 1-2 sale.

Comprising 115 lots, the highest price was achieved by a rare half crown token dating from 1811 showing a view of Staverton Mill in Wiltshire. Guided at £2000-3000, it was bought by a collector in the US at the top estimate.

Silver tokens of such relatively high value are typically much scarcer than the copper tokens that were widely issued as halfpennies, farthings or pennies to fulfil a need for small change. Typically, the minting of tokens of larger denominations was frowned on by the authorities and only tolerated at times of a wider shortage of silver coins.

This particular token, one of the classic examples in the entire series, was issued in 1811 by John Jones, the proprietor of the Staverton Super-fine

Woollen Manufactory. The mill sited on the Avon was said to house 40 looms and the very latest in textile technology. When hostilities between the industrialist and local wool shearmen who feared for their livelihoods reached a peak in 1808, Jones was attacked and shot in the face. His offer of a £500 reward for the capture of the culprits was never claimed.

The year after this coin (and a similar copper penny) was issued, Jones was declared bankrupt in November 1812 and he died within weeks. The mill as depicted on the token, engraved by Thomas Wyon, later burnt down in 1824. Another building was erected on the site the following year and was acquired in 1897 by the Anglo-Swiss Condensing Milk Co, better known today as Nestlé

It is thought to be only the third example of this token offered at auction in the past 30 years, with others selling for £1950 (May 1999) and £1600 (March 2003).

## Baltic beaker

This porcelain beaker from the Baltic Service was the highlight of a timed online sale held by 1818 Auctioneers (22.5% buyer's premium inc VAT) in Cumbria.

When the sale closed on February 6, bidding had reached £3200 (estimate £500-800) from a collector in the south of England.

Painted on Paris porcelain, it is decorated with an oak leaf border and a fouled anchor with the word *Nelson* above and *2nd April, Baltic* beneath. The sides read *14th February* and *The Glorious 1st August*. It was part of a small clearance of a house in Arnside.

The precise origin of the Baltic Service is uncertain but it is generally believed to have belonged to Nelson himself. It is thought that the set – embellished in a London decorating workshop – was part of a presentation of chinaware given to him in 1802 by the Ladies of the City of London.

Nelson's niece, Charlotte Nelson, Duchess of Bronte, accompanied him in the Lord Mayor's Coach and described the excitement of the event: "...I wish you could have seen all the people jumping up to the carriage to see my uncle and thousands of people round

him looking up at him... All the ladies had their handkerchiefs out of the windows when my uncle passed, they and the people calling out 'Nelson for Ever'."

A teaset was delivered to Merton, the house Nelson shared with Emma Hamilton, and is listed there in an 1805 inventory, but other family members are known to have owned elements of the service. By descent from Charlotte, Lord Bridport's auction at Christie's in July 1895 featured many pieces.

Only occasionally do elements turn up for sale today. A teapot from the service sold for £28,000 at a Waterloo theme sale held by Bonhams in 2015 while a coffee cup took £2000 at Hansons last year.

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# Further thoughts on Forbes

Works also sold in Penzance but not for six figures help to understand this market

Works by the first wave of Newlyn School artists created a string of headlines and high prices back in the 1980s-90s, but the market has had to readjust to deal with issues of both supply and demand.

On the demand side, buyers' tastes have moved away somewhat from pre-First World War works with a shift towards pictures from later in the 20th century. When it comes to supply, important pictures by artists such as Stanhope Forbes (1857-1947), Frank Bramley (1857-1915) and Walter Langley (1852-1922) have become scarcer over the last 20 years, with many now held in museums or well established private collections.


Having been over four years since a major Newlyn School painting came to auction, it was understandable that one that emerged at the latest **David Lay (18% buyer's premium)** sale in Penzance attracted considerable attention.

As featured on the front page of ATG No 2530, Forbes' Soldiers and Sailors, an impressively scaled Royal Academy exhibit showing a crowd of figures on a harbour, was estimated at £120,000-180,000 and sold at £155,000.

While it drew three bidders and sold to dealer David Messum safely within estimate, some people might have expected it to make more. "It's a very important work, but I didn't think I'd be able to buy it," Messum told *ATG*.

It is difficult to gauge whether it was market factors or the condition of the work that held more sway. The picture had undergone restoration due to it being rolled up (presumably for safekeeping during the Blitz) and not all parties were convinced as to how well it would clean and restore now. Condition, of course, is as vitally important when it comes to Victorian pictures as with other sectors.

While it was undoubtedly a significant work painted during a key period by the 'father' of the Newlyn School (the over-used term 'museumquality' may rightly be applied here), art historical importance and financial value are not always completely entwined in the Victorian art market.

Inevitably the market tends to favour sunnier scenes, ideally with fishermen and their boats (A Fish Sale on a Cornish Beach from 1884-5 is arguably Forbes' most celebrated work), whereas this picture depicted a group of Salvation Army singers on a somewhat grey day.

Two further works by the artist in the David Lay sale came from different sources and also tested the market but again underlined these commercial realities. Bringing In The Herd reflected the range of other subjects Forbes depicted as he aimed to show the 'honest endeavour' of local life in Cornwall such as farms, blacksmiths and other industries and interiors.

The 21¾ x 19¾in (55.5 x 50cm) oil on canvas laid on board here was a study probably for a larger agricultural scene. It came to auction from a local private client and the condition was relatively good with only some minor restoration required (it had one tiny area of retouching and some yellow varnish).

With its value probably limited by its subject matter and the fact that the lower section was left a bit unfinished, it had previously appeared at a Phillips sale in London back in 1987 where it was seemingly unsold against a £7000-9000 estimate.

Here it was pitched at £8000-12,000 and performed relatively well by comparison, selling at £13,500 to a private buyer who was new to the saleroom and who registered as a phone bidder barely minutes before the auction started.

The other work at David Lay was also a study for a larger painting and represented yet another side of the Forbes canon. The 3ft 8in x 2ft 7in (1.11m x 78cm) signed oil on canvas

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was a study for Forbes' largest public commission – two murals he painted for the Royal Exchange in London.

They were completed as part of the regeneration programme between 1895-1927 when a series of around 30 striking panels depicting scenes from London's history by different artists were installed on the building's mezzanine (they have since been described as the city's best-kept secret).

Forbes' initial contribution was a depiction of the 1666 Great Fire of London – he completed the mural in 1899. His second panel was unveiled much later in 1921 and was titled *The Destruction of the Second Royal Exchange in 1838.* The premises burnt down in January of that year but had been reconstructed by the late 19th century.

The work at David Lay was a study of the figures to the lower left of the latter mural. Signed and dated 1920, it showed a mother and two children who were among the locals gathering to watch the spectacle of the building burning during the height of the fire. It came to auction from a collector of Newlyn School works and was described as 'in excellent restored and lined condition'.

Despite being a well-handled study which closely relates to the finished work, again its value may have been limited as its appeal was probably more academic than commercial.

Estimated at £6000-8000, it sold at £5800 to the same buyer as *Bringing In The Herd*.

#### **Art and Craft**

Another Newlyn painting selling a bit under estimate was *A Tiff* by Percy Robert Craft (1856-1934).

The artist, who was also a professional actor and arts administrator (he was director of the Newlyn artists' informal dramatic society), lodged with Forbes in the early 1880s and showed his works alongside his better-known contemporary as well as the likes of Walter Langley and Thomas Cooper Gotch (1854–1931).

This appears to be one of his major works. According to a note in *The Cornishman* in 1898, the 2ft 8in x 4ft 6in (82cm x 1.36m) signed oil on canvas was exhibited at the 'Newlyn Showday', the annual exhibition of works intended for the Royal Academy.

It came to auction from a dealer and was estimated at £15,000-20,000, a level that looked a bit punchy as, according to Artprice, the highest price recorded for the artist at auction stands at £15,000 for *The New Song* at WH Lane back in 2002.

However, the fact that it was a large and colourful picture with an interesting subject, especially the interplay between the characters and the ray fish appearing in the foreground, stood in its favour. The auction house pointed out that the work may have even contained an element of humour, something rarely seen in the artist's ouevre or indeed other in Newlyn School works.

Knocked down at £14,000 to a private client bidding online, the sum fetched was seemingly the second highest for the artist at auction.

Outside the Newlyn pictures, a self-portrait by Fred Yates (1922-2008) attracted interest against a £1000-1500 estimate. The artist appears regularly at auction, most often his colourful Lowry-esque urban and coastal scenes, and works often emerge in the south-west as the Manchester artist moved down to Cornwall in 1969 when he took up painting full time.

While Yates painted dozens of self-portraits, they are less commonly seen on the secondary market and this example was deemed one of his better attempts. The 10½ x 8in (27 x 20cm) signed oil on board came to auction from a private West Country client having been through another local auction house back in 2009 (the price was not disclosed).

Here it brought a decent competition and sold at £2000 to a Penzance buyer who, the saleroom believed, may have known the artist himself.

## **Pooch pair from Emms**

A couple of dog portraits by leading Victorian canine painter **John Emms** (1844-1912) brought a flurry of bids at separate auctions held just a day apart.

First up at **Parker Fine Art Auctions** (25% buyer's premium) in Farnham on February 10 was a small but finely conceived head of a spaniel. Possibly executed as a preparatory work for a larger portrait, the 6in (15cm) square oil on canvas was smaller than comparable sketches that have emerged before but was nevertheless a characterful study with rapid and fluent brushwork that clearly appealed to buyers.

Head of a Spaniel was estimated at an attractive £400-600 and, after bringing strong interest, sold at £6200. The only small-scale work by Emms to have recorded more at auction was Study of a Hound that made £12,000 at an online Christie's sale in 2020 (source: Artprice).

When it comes to Emms, who specialised in painting dogs and

sporting scenes from 1881 onwards after moving to Lyndhurst in the New Forest, fox hounds are the breed that command the most money. This is then followed by terriers, with spaniels and setters tending to come the next branch down (he also painted other breeds such as collies, Jack Russells and St Bernards as well as different animals).

Meanwhile, **David Lay (18% buyer's premium)** offered an Emms painting of a setter on the second day of its sale in Penzance on February 10-11.

The 17 x 22in (44 x 56cm) signed oil on canvas came from a private vendor and was described in the catalogue as being in "very honest, original condition". It was also billed as "a very fine work and will look fantastic when cleaned". Re-entered from a previous sale where it had failed to sell, it was estimated here at £2500-4500.

Bringing decent competition, it sold also at £6200 to an online buyer.

## Study heads up a Knight selection

Early works by **Harold Knight (1874-1961**) are not seen very often at auction but a group of six appeared at Mellors & Kirk of Nottingham at the end of last year.

The artist is strongly associated with the Newlyn School, having moved to the Cornish fishing village with his wife Laura in 1907, but these works were all from the period 1888-95 when he was a precocious student at Nottingham School of Art.

The four charcoal drawings and two oil paintings were consigned by a descendant of Frederick Riley, an art teacher at the school.

R John Croft, the great-nephew of Laura Knight, helped with the cataloguing and will include them in the forthcoming Knight catalogue raisonné.

At the auction on December 14, they all sold for a combined £7950.

The highest price came for one of the charcoal drawings: a head and shoulders study of an unknown boy (left). Measuring 17 x 11½in (43 x 29.5cm), it was described in the catalogue as a 'meticulous and empathetic portrait reminiscent

## Hail Mary (plus Mary and Mary)

Queen of Scots, Wollstonecraft and Shelley lots star in a 'classical and romantic' selection

A secretarial letter of 1568 to which Mary, Queen of Scots, who had only recently escaped from captivity at Lochleven Castle, had added her own autograph note, led a February 2 sale held by Lyon & Turnbull (25/20% buyer's premium) of Edinburgh at £26,000.

It was among the books, manuscripts, maps and photographs from what was billed as the Classical & Romantic library of the historian and writer, the late William St Clair, that made up this sale.

Mary's note was added to an official request to the French ambassador at Elizabeth I's court that asked that the bearer, George Douglas, who was carrying letters from Mary to King Charles IX and Catherine de Medici, be granted safe passage to France.

#### Mother and daughter

A copy of a portrait of Mary Wollstonecraft that hangs in the National Gallery is featured among the accompanying illustrations, but amid those lots that produced much, much higher than estimated sums was a 1789 first in later, broken boards of a work by an elocution teacher, a Mr Creswick.

This exceptionally rare work was prefixed by a 'Preface containing some hints on Female Education' by Wollstonecraft and it sold at £9500, some 10 times the high estimate.

In a broken binding and seriously dampstained and browned, an 1831 third edition of her daughter, Mary Shelley's most famous book, *Frankenstein*, issued by Colburn & Bentley as part of their 'Standard Novels' series and bearing on the frontispiece and title-page the first illustrations of her most famous creation, realised £6000.

In 1826 Colburn had printed two editions of Shelley's *The Last Man* in England and a third in Paris. A copy of the latter, still in the original wrappers, was sold at £4000.

## **Black Forest tale**



Among other lots sold for far higher than expexted sums was an unpublished manuscript called 'Description de la Ville de Constantinople et de ses Antiquites'. Running to 242pp and vellum bound, this was an unpublished work by Georges Guillet de St George, probably dating from the 1670s. It made £14,000 rather than the suggested £500-700.



An even higher increase over estimate was recorded for a lot offering *The Plan of the French Encyclopedia*, a 1752 English language version of the 10pp Encyclopédie, ou Dictionnaire Raisonné des Sciences. Proposés par Souscription of the previous year.

The latter lacked a double-page 'Systême Figuré des Connoisances Humaines' but the lot sold at £16,000 rather than £250-350. ■

## Truly super set of prices

A four-day US sale of comics and comic art produced some extraordinary results – with 4900 would-be buyers registered and every one of the 1333 lots sold to bring a premium-inclusive total of \$23.76m (£17.34m).

Among the star turns and sold at \$2.8m (£2.04m) at this January 13-16 sale at **Heritage (20% buyer's premium)** was Mike Zeck's artwork for a single page from *Secret Wars* No 8, a publication of 1984 that tells the story of how the Web-Slinger came by his now iconic black costume.

For those not familiar with all these comic legends, and I include myself among that number, this was a character, or rather a costume that proved to be alive and have its own agenda, morphing into a villain and antihero known as Venom.

What the consignor paid in the late



1980s for this artwork was not revealed, but moments earlier another single-page artwork produced for that same issue of a comic that was initially intended to help sell toys had been bid to \$240,000 (£175,180). Whoever it was certainly had a very special day at auction.

More instantly recognisable to those not overly familiar with the super-heroes and heroines of the comic world will be a copy of *Action Comics* No 1 of 1938 in which Jerry Siegel and Joe Schuster introduced the world to Superman – aka Clark Kent – and Lois Lane. Graded CGC 6.0, it made an auction-record \$2.65m (£1.93m).

The highest graded copy that Heritage has ever offered, it is one also known as the 'Rocket Copy' from the red spaceship stamped on the cover by its then 13-year-old first, and until this sale, only owner.

This exceptional first session of the Heritage event also included a copy of *Detective Comics* No 27 of 1939, the issue that marked the first appearance of Bob Kane's creation, Batman.

Graded CGC 4.5, it was billed as a "miraculous survival", having almost been discarded some decades after its original purchase. It sold at \$950,000 (£693,430).

Other high spots included, at \$300,000 (£218,980) apiece, a copy of Marvel Comics No 1 of 1939, graded CGC 4.5, which features the Human Torch and tells the story of the Sub-Mariner's origin, and Dave Cockrum's black and white artwork for the cover of X-Men No 107 of 1977.

The latter featured the debut of what Heritage termed "obscure space pirates called the Starjammers".

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## Previews Our weekly selection from salerooms

Studio ceramics from the collection formed over 40 years by New York art dealer Dr John P Driscoll set many new benchmarks when sold as a joint auction by Maak and Phillips in 2021. The Art of Fire sale generated more than £5m.

Driscoll (whose dealing speciality was Hudson River School pictures) owned more than 1600 pots and a further 230 lots will be offered by Maak in a timed online sale titled East Meets West closing on March 10.

It includes this c.1962 incised earthenware water pot by the Nigerian potter Ladi Kwali whose work reached new highs in The Art of Fire (a record £105,000). This 15in (38cm) high pot with zoomorphic designs is estimated at £6000-8000.



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# Women: righting the wrongs

A look at exhibitions staged to coincide with the international day of celebration

by Frances Allitt

International Women's Day (March 8) is a chance to celebrate the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women around the world. Here, we look at a trio of dealerships holding events to mark the occasion.

#### **AntikBar**

Red bombs fall from a sheaf of wheat like drops of blood and explode in a Soviet poster from the Second World War offered in Chelsea gallery **Antik Bar**'s next exhibition.

Produced in 1941 shortly after the Nazis invaded, it bears a slogan which translates to 'Let's deal the enemy a blow with Bolshevik harvesting'. It is an arresting image, and one strikingly in contrast with posters of women from other countries during the war.

Opening on International Women's Day and running until May 9, Fighting on All Fronts: Women at War showcases 50 original posters, primarily from the UK, the US and the USSR.

"Each country's posters show a different picture of women, even when the countries were allies," says Antik Bar's Kirill Kalinin. "The experience and the imagery are very different in each."

For example, the USSR poster, designed by Alexei Sittaro and available for £3500, is in sharp contrast to a 1944 poster from the US for Coast Guard SPARS (the women's reserve). Where the Russian woman is grimly determined, bulky and every inch a worker, the American is all glamour, fully made up and smiling in a neat uniform. *Make a Date with Uncle Sam*, the poster reads. Designed by Bradshaw Crandell, it is offered for £750.

"In Russia there was the occupation. Women were involved in the conflict and it was much more brutal. The images are much more aggressive and immediate. In America, impact on daily life was minimal. There was rationing, but rallying efforts for participation are more elevated, pin-up-y glamorous. It suggests, if you join the effort you'll be like this," Kalinin says.

In Britain, which experienced the Blitz, food shortages and rationing, women were encouraged to support

the troops, handling war logistics and safety measures. Here the imagery on posters emphasised practical efforts and the enemy is referenced only obliquely.

A 1941 poster, from the UK, shows a smiling woman in brown workers' overalls, with military planes overhead, encouraging women to *Come into the Factories*. Priced at £5500, it was designed by Philip Zec.

While the role of women at this time was quite diverse, Kalinin says, "it's an area that's not represented well in the media. Women had to deal with daily issues and family as well as supporting the troops and even fighting."

He adds that the aim of the show is primarily to educate. "For us, this exhibition is not commercial. Obviously we are a gallery and we want to sell posters, but we really wanted to raise awareness."

To complement the posters there will be a series of events. These include a talk by Kate Clements, curator of the new Second World War galleries at the Imperial War Museum, on *Hidden Stories of Women in WWII* (March 30) and *Wartime* 

Women: The Khaki Cabaret, a tribute by actress and singer Fiona-Jane Weston (April 27).

The war had a dramatic effect, if sometimes only temporary, on women's social and professional positions. However, it is notable that few of the posters were by women.

Graphic design was a notoriously difficult world to break into, Kalinin says, and before the war only one organisation (Transport for London) employed women poster designers in the UK.

#### **Richard Saltoun**

Marking the 10th anniversary of her death, the show runs from March 9-May 7. It includes a collection of paintings from across her career priced at €12,000-120,000.

Known sometimes as the 'mother of contemporary African painting',

#### **Liss Llewellyn**


Twentieth century British art specialist **Liss Llewellyn** marks International Women's Day with a trio of exhibitions.

The first is an online selling show of pictures that were recently exhibited in WOW: Women Only Works on Paper, which the firm curated at the Laing Art Gallery in Newcastle. It was staged to "address the omissions and erasures that are inherent in public art galleries", drawing on Liss

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## Goldman's Kyosai collection goes on show

Dealer Israel Goldman's private collection of paintings by 19th century Japanese artist Kawanabe Kyosai (1831-89) will go on show from March this year.

The exhibition *Kyosai: The Israel Goldman Collection* runs from March 19-June 19 at the Royal Academy of Arts and will focus on the art of *sekiga*, 'spontaneous paintings', produced at 'calligraphy and painting parties' (*shogakai*).

According to the RA, these pictures were often fuelled by prodigious amounts of sake and reveal a comical twist reflecting the artist's take on society.

The artist was overlooked for many years and this show is the first monographic exhibition of Kyosai's work in the UK since 1993.

It includes around 80 works, many of which have never been exhibited or published, from the collection of Goldman, a dealer in Japanese prints, paintings and illustrated books.

#### Sleeper was a keeper

Goldman has had been collecting Kyosai since the early 1980s when he bought his "first sleeper" for which he paid the "princely sum of £55 at a Phillips sale in London".

He said: "I had just started to deal and was rather impoverished but couldn't bear to part with the



painting and it has been at the core of my collection ever since."

He admitted that when he started collecting he tried to avoid competing with his clients by focusing on a single artist – Kyosai – who was underappreciated at the time.

The exhibition will be



accompanied by a publication written by Dr Sadamura Koto as well as a book on Kyosai's animal images, Kyosai's Animal Circus.

Works belonging to Goldman have been the subject of a number of exhibitions over the years.

As a dealer he sold a group of 103

block-ready drawings by Japanese artist Katsushika Hokusai (1760-1849) to the British Museum in 2020. As reported in *ATG* (*News Digest*, Nos 2458 and 2459), Goldman had acquired the drawings when they were offered at a Piasa auction in 2019. He sold them to the museum for £270,000 with support from the Art Fund. This collection was exhibited last year.

He was also a major lender to the museum's Kyosai exhibition, held in 1993, as well as shows in Tokyo in 2002 and 2017

Goldman – also a guest curator at the last Japanese themed exhibition at the RA, *Kuniyoshi* in 2009 – said RA president Rebecca Salter saw the 2017 exhibition in Japan and they began discussing opportunities.

He added: "I always maintained good contact but seeing that exhibition encouraged Rebecca to ask whether I would consider having a Kyosai exhibition in London" and the idea of the show was formed.

## Hartnoll figures it's time to promote neglected art

Window to Hardy Road, 1965, by John Bratby (1928-92) is among the figurative works offered at **Julian Hartnoll**'s next exhibition *Unjustly Forgotten: Unjustly* Neglected.

The show, running from March 7-19 at **The Maas Gallery**, features paintings by the British Kitchen Sink painter alongside works by French 20th century 'naïf' artists.

Both groups of works have been underappreciated, but with the fashion for figurative art on the rise again, according to the seasoned dealer, now could be the time to snap up some prime pieces.

Though Hartnoll sold several large Bratbys to Charles Saatchi in the early 2000s and though French outsider artists had a vogue in the 1930s, the show in question seeks to boost their profile for a modern audience.

Among the French artists represented are Emile Blondel (1893-1970), Camille Bombois (1883-1970) and Jean Fous (1901-71), with works offered at prices of £1200-12,000.

Hartnoll says that this is an area of the market "where there are still significant



pictures which can be bought by a younger generation for accessible prices".

He has been dealing and exhibiting for more than 50 years, starting with the Pre-Raphaelites and moving on to the Symbolists, and has helped build the 19th



century collections of Fred Koch and Joe Setton

Hartnoll has since focused on 20th century works and deals online through Hartnoll & Daughters.



In the auction, art and antiques calendar March in the Big Apple is a month when the spotlight traditionally falls on Asian art.

It is the time of year when the main international firms hold the first of their biannual New York Asian auction series and, since 2009, it has been the time when specialist dealers in this field collectively stage a series of selling exhibitions in the galleries around Manhattan.

It all falls under the umbrella of Asia Week New York (AWNY), an annual celebration of Asian art encompassing auctions and dealers' shows alongside exhibitions in museums.

For this year's AWNY, running from March 16-25, six auction firms are taking part: Christie's, Sotheby's, Bonhams, Doyle, Heritage and iGavel. There are 26 participating dealers, with more present in person than last year when covid meant many dealers opted for a virtual presence.

Over the next five pages we give a taste of what will be on offer in the auction rooms and dealers' galleries and, as always, much more information can be found on the AWNY website.

Heritage has an Asian art auction in Dallas on March 22 and will be previewing highlights from the sale in New York from March 16-21. The auction will include this pair of 18th century, Chinese Imperial Qing dynasty carved zitan lanterns measuring 2ft 2in x 13¾in (66 x 35cm).

They have a provenance to a private collection in New York and are estimated at \$50,000-70,000.

## Doyle

Doyle is holding a live auction of Asian Works of Art in New York on March 21 as well as a timed auction titled Asian Works of Art: Session II which closes on March 25.

One of the highlights of the March 21 auction will be this large 19½ in (49.5cm) celadon Dragon charger with a Yongzheng seal mark and of the period. The central medallion features a dragon among clouds while the underside is moulded with overlapping lotus petals. The charger, which comes with a labelled Japanese wooden collector's box, has a provenance to the collection of an American Civilian Educational Coordinator stationed in Japan, 1948-51, and then by descent.

The estimate is \$80,000-120,000

### Christie's

Christie's auction schedule for *Asia Week New York* comprises a mix of live and online, various owner and single-owner sales across a wide range of Asian art categories, ancient and contemporary.

Offered in two sessions – one online from March 15-29, the other live on March 24 – will be Rivers and Mountains Far from the World: Important Chinese Snuff Bottles from the Rachelle R Holden Collection.

The sales take their title from the scholarly catalogue published in 1994 by the late collector who purchased her first snuff bottle in 1974. The two sales between them offer over 220 bottles made from a variety of materials: glass, porcelain, hardstones and enamelled metal.


A highlight of the collection is a Qianlong mark and period famille rose enamelled glass bottle from the Imperial Palace workshops which has an estimate of \$400,000-600,000.

Christie's auction of Japanese and Korean Art on March 22 will include 20 lots of Buddhist paintings from the collection of David and Nayda Utterberg, while the March 23 South Asian Modern and Contemporary Art sale features works from the collection of Mahinder and Sharad Tak, long-time patrons of the arts.

Works on offer from the latter collection include paintings by Bhupen Khakhar, Manjit Bawa, Arpita Singh and Sayed Haider Raza as well as works by Maqbool Fida Husain, Rameshwar Broota, Jogen Chowdhury and Jagdish Swaminathan, all close friends of the collectors.

### Bonhams

Bonhams' programme of auctions for *Asia Week New York* includes live and online-only sales ranging across Chinese works of art including the Richard Milhender export furniture collection; Japanese and Korean art; a single-owner sale of Chinese paintings and calligraphy; Indian, Himalayan and south-east Asian art and Burmese silver.

The auction house's headline lot is a gilt copper alloy figure of the Buddhist saviour goddess Tara from Nepal dating from the early Malla period (13th century) which will feature in the March 22 sale of Indian, Himalayan and south-east Asian Art.

The figure has come from the collection of Michael Henss, a noted Himalayan art scholar, and retains remnants of cold gold and blue pigment to the face and hair indicating its prior worship in Tibet. The estimate is **\$500,000-700,000**.

On March 21 Bonhams will offer the fourth instalment of paintings and calligraphic works from the collection of the Rev Richard Fabian. Founder and rector of San Francisco's

ecumenical St Gregory Nyssen Episcopal church, he first discovered Chinese paintings while majoring in Chinese art at Yale University in the 1960s and spent over three decades forming a panoramic collection spanning the 200-year development of modern Chinese paintings. Part 5 of the Fabian collection will be offered as an online sale from March 14-24

The online component of Bonhams' Asia Week sales also includes the March 14-24 sale of the Noble Silver Collection: Treasures from the Burmese Silver Age – works produced by Burmese master silversmiths between the mid-19th and early 20th century.

Burmese silver catered largely to a domestic market producing objects designed for traditional south-east Asian customs such as betel culture and temple offerings including a silver betel box dated 1909 from lower Burma (Myanmar).

### Sotheby's

Sotheby's Asia Week auctions will feature the first of a series of four single-owner sales from the Dr Wou Kiuan collection to be held globally through 2022

It spans 4000 years of Chinese culture and art history featuring more than 1000 works including pottery, porcelain, jades, bronzes, paintings and calligraphy and is estimated to achieve over \$40m.

Wou Kiuan, the son of Wou Lien-Pai, a prominent politician instrumental in the reformation of China in the Republic period, settled in London after his retirement devoting his time to the study of Chinese archaeology and art. From the mid-1950s to 1960s he built up a collection representing every category of Chinese art. In 1968 he created a private gallery in his home titled the Wou Lien Pai Museum in honour of his father.

This first sale from the collection takes place in New York on March 22 under the title A Journey through China's History: The Dr Wou Kiuan Collection Part I.

Among its highlights will be the 14th century carved cinnabar lacguer 'hibiscus' dish shown here. Dating from the peak period of Chinese lacquer craftsmanship, the late Yuan/early Ming dynasty, its decoration is unusual in being limited to three blooms among foliage, a design more typically seen on much smaller pieces.

Sotheby's Asia Week schedule also includes a live auction of Modern and Contemporary South Asian art on March 21 and an online auction, China/5000 years, running from March 16-29.

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
# Big deals in the Big Apple

Some 26 galleries will be participating in the dealers' section of Asia Week New York either in person at a variety of city galleries or online. The 22 taking part in person are a mix of resident dealers in their own premises and guest exhibitors taking gallery space for the occasion. Note that for many of the galleries admission is by prior appointment.

On offer is a broad mix of Asian works from ancient to Contemporary, Indian and south Asian to Chinese, Japanese and Korean, spanning paintings, ceramics, works of art, textiles, metalware and more.

Pictured here is a taste of what will be on offer from five of the exhibitions being staged by participants this spring.

### Francesca Galloway and Luhring Augustine Tribeca

London dealer Francesca Galloway and New York dealer Luhring Augustine Tribeca are collaborating to present an exhibition titled Court Epic Spirit: Indian Art 15th-19th Century which is now open and runs through AWNY until March 24 at the White Street Tribeca location.

The title of the exhibition refers to three key lenses through which the multi-faceted arts of India can been viewed.

Among the highlights to be featured will be a 17th century panel from a royal tent, part of a group thought to have been produced in the Deccan; a rare mid-19th century Deccani painted cotton temple cloth or pichhvai painted with a scene of Krishna playfully demanding a toll from the gopis and a group of 17th century ragamala paintings that evoke musical modes.

Another stand-out item will be a 16th century painting from the Mughal epic the Hamzanama (The Story of Hamza) which was commissioned by the young Emperor Akbar. This particular scene depicts Amir Hamzir clinging to the legs of Rukh, a giant bird, so that he can carry him home across the sea. Not only is it the only known folio depicting of this particular episode but it is also notable for being attributed to Dasvant, a master artist of the Imperial atelier.

Prices start from \$20,000 and the exhibition is accompanied by an illustrated catalogue.

### Joan B Mirviss

During AWNY, New York dealer Joan B Mirviss will be presenting Kondo Takahiro: Making Waves, an exhibition of sculptural works at the dealer's East 78th street gallery. There are 30 new works in marbleised porcelain by this Contemporary artist in the show, from human-sized monolithic works to teabowls. Prices range from \$8000-80,000.

Takahiro (b.1958), who is descended from a line of Kyoto blue and white porcelain masters, has always been focused on water, especially as a life-giving and spiritual force. However, following the devastating 2011 Tōhoku earthquake and tsunami, the artist gained new perspective on the dichotomy of water's creative and destructive powers.

In a departure from his earlier Wave artworks, Kondo incorporates a white clay into his marbleisation technique and its combination


with the darker clay that appears to flow down the surfaces creates an ink on paper effect transforming the works into what he calls "porcelain ink paintings". The works feature his signature gintekisai (silver mist) glaze resembling a morning dew effect.

Displayed alongside Takahiro's works will be ink paintings by the Chinese artist Bingyi (b.1975) presented by the Beijing and New York gallery INKstudio.

### Sebastian Izzard LCC Asian Art

New York dealer Sebastian Izzard LCC Asian Art will be holding a spring exhibition devoted to *surimono* at its East 76th Street Gallery during AWNY.

Surimono are the privately commissioned counterparts to commercial Japanese woodblock prints of the late 18th-early 19th centuries. Produced in small numbers for a mostly educated audience of literati, cost was not a primary consideration in their production, unlike in commercial publishing.

Accordingly, they were often more experimental in subject matter and treatment – and extravagant in printing techniques. The poetic texts which often appear on them were as important as the illustrations and because they were privately printed and distributed, *surimono* neither had to be approved by the censor nor bear publisher's seals.

The *shikishiban*, or square paper shape, soon became the format of choice among the many artists hired to design *surimono*. By the turn of the 18th and 19th centuries *surimono* had evolved into two main forms: as an announcement or invitation to a special event; and as prints individually commissioned by poets or poetry groups to serve as a vehicle for illustrating

their verses. The amateur poets who paid to have their poems included were often wealthy and their patronage was a lucrative source of income for artists.

Two artistic groups dominated *surimono* production: one led by group Katsushika Hokusai (1760-1849) and his school, the other by the artists led by Utagawa Toyokuni (1769-1825) and after his death, Utagawa Kunisada (1786-1865).

Another highlight on show at the gallery will be a rare complete first edition set of Hiroshige's (1797-1858) *Eight Views of the Suburbs of Edo* thought to have been completed around 1837-38 when the artist was aged 40. It was commissioned by the Taihaido Poets Society and the eight landscapes each feature a beauty spot in the far suburbs of Edo with the best poems composed by the group selected for inclusion on the landscapes. Only first-edition sets include all the poems.

Prices for most of the prints in the exhibition range from \$10,000-45,000, with the exception of the Hiroshige set, and the show is accompanied by an illustrated catalogue.


### Oliver Forge and Brendan Lynch


Oliver Forge and Brendan Lynch from London will be participating in *AWNY* this year at 67 East 80th Street bringing *India and Iran: Works on Paper*, a selection of 30 paintings reflecting court traditions, both Hindu and Muslim, accompanied by a catalogue.


The highlight of the show, with a price on application, is a rare large page from a Safavid manuscript of c.1576-7, *The Accession Shahnama of Shah Ismail II of Iran*. The folio depicts Kay Khusrau, mythical king of Iran and the hero of the Shahnama, meeting Piran, vizier to king Afrasiab of Khotan, an ancient Silk Road kingdom in present day Xinjiang, China. The painting, which uses a palette of blues, reds, yellows and greens on an unusual mauve ground, is signed by the court artist Zayn al'Abidin who contributed six paintings to the manuscript.


Other works in the exhibition include an early 18th century portrait of Timur, conqueror and founder of the Mughal royal line; a stippled equestrian portrait of Sarup Singh, one of the last great patrons of the Mewar court at Udaipur, by Parasuram, which is dated 1859 and was formerly in the British Rail collection, and a Company School watercolour from the celebrated album produced for Lady Impey, the wife of Elijah Impey chief Justice of Bengal.

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



# Relink the French connection

The latest Covid restrictions to be eased make a buying trip across the Channel more realistic

by Joan Porter

Travel to France just got easier with the cessation of pre-departure Covid tests, but proof of full vaccination is required for entry.

Less easy are the requirements post-Brexit around buying antiques and vintage in France. Nicolas Martin, CEO of the website fleamarketfinders.com, sent us a lengthy report – the first paragraph is condensed here.

"Since January 1, 2021, antiques imported into the UK from EU states are subject to VAT at 5%. This rate applies whether the items are imported privately or are for reselling via a VAT-registered business. Documentary evidence is needed to show if items are more than 100 years old. Vintage items are subject to the standard VAT rate of 20%."

(The website gov.uk/topic/business-tax/import-export sets it all out.)

Here are a few French antiques events to try in March.

### **International interest**

The biannual *Foire de Chatou* held on the outskirts of Paris is a long-haul event for the 450-plus predominately French dealers who show here.

They will be hoping for the return of buyers from China, Japan, Korea, Russia and Lebanon who have been strong buyers in the past.

The fair is held for a busy 10 days with the upcoming event running from Friday, March 11 (trade day March 10), to Sunday, March 20.

France's largest brocante, this offers a strong mix of antiques, fine art, modern design, vintage furniture and is big on French ceramics and desirable kitchenalia. The gastro alleys are memorable.

### Flooding in for flea

Once a year huge crowds descend on the small village of Le Plessis-Brion in the Oise department of northern France with just 1000 inhabitants when hundreds of fleamarket stalls line the small streets from vendors across France.

Le Grande Brocante de Le Plessis-Brion has been held annually since the 1990s and this year's event runs on Sunday, March 13, starting at 6am.

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

### Obituary - Peter Twining (1935-2022)

The remarkably talented antique dealer Peter Twining died on January 25, having reached the fine age of 86 after gracing the London trade with his distinctive eye for grand furniture of character and unique works of art over a period of 50 years.

Born in Oxford on November 20, 1935, Peter read law at Hertford College, Oxford, after his National Service in the army in Malava.

Moving to London, Peter started from scratch. With a modest inheritance he set up shop at the heart of swinging sixties King's Road in Chelsea, where his star shone bright within that constellation of creativity.

His long slender shop close to Paultons Square gave insight into Peter's ideal interior, the window typically centring on an ornate 18th century Irish side table, perhaps attended by some fine early Islamic metalwork and crowned with a full length 17th/18th century noble portrait or a wonderful dog or horse painting.

His pioneering spirit during the mid sixties was perhaps a foundational influence on the contemporary London trade, and even, the antiques trade further afield.

Peter was constant, he never retired, trading primarily in London and briefly in New York, his purpose unaltered – to express his vision through his seeking and his capacity to measure and to appreciate.

In later decades, as dealer and collector, he'd busy himself at Portobello Road, never missing a Saturday market and every week calling in to see his favourite dealers and hoping to spot an engaging piece, a large

scale Middle Eastern or Indian brass lota always a favourite to find.

An exceptional character, singular in aesthetic and creative discipline, of unique and inspirational vision, Peter was a modest self-effacing man for whom friends were very much a passion and consequently a great good fortune for those who knew him.

A memorial will take place early in this coming spring, the date to be announced shortly.

### Obituary – James 'Jim' Anthony Hill (1942-2022)

After a long and successful career in industry as a time-served craftsman initially (skills which made him a talented restorer later on), rising to management in the coachbuilding sector, Jim and Shirley (his ever-present wife) became full-time dealers in 1997.

Jim had always been a passionate and knowledgeable collector with an in-depth understanding of ceramics, treen, antique prints, diecast toys and vintage radios and audio equipment. He turned this to great advantage when he started Fairway Antiques in Shepshed, Leicestershire.

For 15 years Jim and Shirley never missed a Newark or Swinderby and they stood at the prestigious NEC fair every year always with great success. Peterborough was another fair they attended.

Jim's eye for quality and attention to detail ensured that they always put on a great show for the collecting public, and he gained a reputation for excellent and consistent quality at fair prices among both collectors and the trade.


He considered his years in the trade as the best of his life and derived great happiness and satisfaction from being part of the antique dealing community.

As a dealer he was a familiar face at most local auction houses in the East Midlands, such as Bamfords, Gildings, Hansons, Arthur Johnson and Churchgate.

Jim was forced to retire early due to his own ill health in 2012 and then became a full-time carer for Shirley, who he sadly lost in 2019. He lost his own long battle with illness on January 30.

His biggest regrets were that he had not become a full-time antique dealer years earlier and that he not spent more money on antiques over the years... oh yes, and all those things he'd sold of course that he wished he'd kept (isn't that the dealer's lot in a nutshell?).

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# It was not to be: I had to suffer the pings of outrageous fortune

Re: Michael Leigh Mallory's metal detecting find of the Henry III gold penny sold by Spink (ATG No 2528).

Michael Leigh Mallory was either blessed or lucky with the find of this coin sold for £540,000, but as my experience of detecting with him shows, detecting can follow an entertaining pattern of varied fortunes.

Michael and I are friends of 22 years; we detected together for several years around 2008-12. We each purchased identical Bulgarianmade Gold Mask detectors and later both of us enthusiastically upgraded from model 1 to model 3+.

Notable, however, was the frequency of 'coinciding finds' made as we two friends detected alongside each other as both detectors would often bleep simultaneously.

The field near Hemyock where the celebrated Henry III coin was found was one of our early detecting sites. I clearly recall that as we passed within

what I now realise was within 5-15ft of this coin, he and I simultaneously yelled 'coin signal!'

He uncovered a good condition 1596 silver half groat of Elizabeth 1 while my spade produced a corroded 1914 copper ha'penny.

On a different area of the same farm, while detecting an ancient footpath Mike dug three good condition silver coins dating between 1815-1915 while I simultaneously found respectively: a belt buckle, a suitcase fastener and a Georgian furniture key... Both of us were following the exact same track.

At another local Blackdown Hills

farm, while I was lovingly uncovering a Victorian grocer's 1/4lb weight he uncovered a valuable Georgian period falconer's silver identity leg tag identifying the falcon owner as being from an important Somerset manor

On another occasion locally, he unearthed a vintage car bonnet mascot of a classical maiden while I found a lost bath tap.

It all became part of a long pattern of usually Mike finding hammered silver coins, while I found squashed beer cans. Eventually I found this quite funny.

I remember our first fishing trip together... guess what? I caught a 2lb bass while he landed a 16lb cod.

I still cherish my musket ball and my 1937 half-crown. Am I hard-doneby? Definitely not, but I should be asking Michael about next week's lottery numbers!

Gregory Edmund, senior numismatist and auctioneer at Spink, described the metal-detecting find, sold in a special evening sale on January 23, as 'on par with the discoveries of Coenwulf's gold maneus in 2001 and the Edward III double-leopare is 2006.
