# Sotheby's slashes buyer's fees and sets seller's commission at standard rate

Sotheby's has announced a major shake-up of its customers' fees, reducing its buyer's premium for the first time since it was introduced in 1979 and setting sellers' commission at a standard rate. The new

charges will come into effect in May.

Among the headline changes, Sotheby's is abandoning its current three-tiered buyer's premium structure and switching to a simpler two-tiered format. The new rates will be 20% on the hammer price up to \$6m/£5m, and 10% of the hammer price

above \$6m/£5m.

This means Sotheby's premium will be lower than that charged by many regional UK and US salerooms and significantly below the fees charged by its principal market rivals.

Previously the fees at Sotheby's were 26% up to \$1m/£800,000, then 20% up

to \$4.5m/£3.8m, and then 13.9% on the portion of the hammer price beyond those levels. Since 2020 the company also charged an additional 1% administrative fee applied on the hammer price of all individual lots (the so-called 'overhead premium') that has now been scrapped.

Sotheby's key changes for

sellers includes the introduction of a uniform seller's commission rate of 10% on the first \$500,000 or £500,000 of the hammer price per lot. There will be no seller's commission on the portion of the hammer price above \$500,000 (£500,000).

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# Chairs from Chippendale's Brocket Hall suite sold

Part of a sale titled Town and Country featuring the contents of two properties, they went to a UK private buyer for £95,000 (plus 25% buyer's premium), towards the top estimate of £100,000.

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If a bid is placed in the final few minutes before the auction closes for that lot, the time period will be extended by a number of minutes. The auction house can set the number of minutes, usually 10.

This is to stop 'sniping' – a practice used by bidders on some other websites whereby they rush to place bids in the last few seconds to prevent other bidders being able to respond before the auction closes.

# Third Qing 'dragon boat' flask emerges in US

A potentially important famille rose porcelain moon flask, recently used as a lamp, raced away from its \$1000-2000 estimate to sell for \$155,000 (£123,000) at a small saleroom in the

Multiple bidders speculated it was made at the imperial kilns for the Qing emperor Jiaqing (1796-1820). The winning bid came online via the LiveAuctioneers portal.

Famille-rose decorated moonflasks or bianhu are rarities and the decoration to this 11in (23cm) vessel among the most desirable in all Chinese art. In addition to an imperial yellow ground that is both enamelled and carved - the technique called graviata - the central scene shows children at a dragon boat race during the Duanwu Festival.

### **Auspicious scene**

All of the participants and onlookers in this particular celebration are boys - an auspicious theme that expresses an abiding wish for male offspring that can carry on the familial name and bring prosperity to the family.

It came for sale at Dixon's Crumpton Auction (21% buyer's premium) in Maryland on January 25 from a New Hampshire private collection. Following huge pre-sale interest, the auction house

uploaded more than 50 additional hi-resolution images of the piece to show its many qualities and its imperfect condition. It had some small chips and had been drilled through the centre of the sixcharacter reign mark for use as

Almost 350 potential buyers 'watching' LiveAuctioneers when bidding began, some of them doubtless aware of the spectacular lot. Back in 2007 a pair of moon flasks of this type - but with marks for the emperor Qianlong (1736-96) - surfaced at Henry Adams in Chichester and sold for £760,000 (pictured). They were later offered for sale at Sotheby's in Hong Kong where - deemed apparently unique pieces made for the personal quarters of the Qianlong emperor - they sold for close to £3m.

The first auction is scheduled for March 5 and all instruments for this sale will be sourced from EU countries. It plans a second auction in October.

The UK auctions will continue with four a year in April, June, September and December.

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# Petition crown sets British silver coin record

A new auction record for an English silver coin was set during the New York International Numismatic Convention (NYINC).

A near mint example of the famous 1663 'Petition' crown by Thomas Simon (c. 1623 – 1665) sold for \$800,000 (£631,000) at Heritage Auctions on January 8.

The 40mm 'Petition' Crown is renowned for its artistry and craftsmanship and its story. The coin was masterfully engraved by Thomas Simon, one of the most celebrated medallists and engravers of the 17th century. Bitter at being side-lined after the Restoration, it represented Simon's 'petition' to become Charles II's chief

engraver, the position he held under the Commonwealth.

He used Pierre Blondeau's newly introduced mill and screw press to showcase his skills and create the coin with its extraordinary double-line edge inscription. It reads: Thomas Simon Most Hymbly Prays Your Majesty to Compare This His Tryall With The Dvtch And If More Trvly Drawn & Emboss'd More Grace Fvlly Order'd Grace Fvlly Order'd And More Accvrately Engraven To Relieve Him.

This petition was ultimately unsuccessful, as the king preferred the work of the Roettier brothers (the aforementioned 'Dvtch') who had assisted Charles while he was exiled in Holland.

Fewer than 20 Petition crowns are known with seven residing in various public institutions and museums. This particular coin is the third highest graded example and may be the specimen auctioned by Sotheby, Wilkinson & Hodge in 1903. The estimate

was \$400,000-500,000 with the price reaching \$960,000 including buyer's premium.

### **Security protocols**

This year's NYINC, the 52nd staging of the 100-dealer show, took place from January 11-14 at the Barclay InterContinental Hotel in New York. Security concerns at numismatic events – and a major theft at the fair last year – led the event management to adopt new protocols.

All attendees were required to be issued with and wear a photo ID badge, leading to long lines for registration for those who had not completed advance online registration.

# Sotheby's cuts standard buyer's premium to 20% from May

Sellers of higher value consignments will not have to pay any commission at all where the low estimate is above 5m (£4.5m). When it is between \$20m-\$50m (£18m-45m), sellers will also receive 40% of the buyer's premium in addition to the hammer price. For lots estimated at above \$50m/£45m the arrangement is 'bespoke'. These new fees publicly reflect the sort of arrangement that was previously commonly agreed in private.

Sotheby's is also officially implementing a new 'success fee' of the type that Christie's introduced to its vendor's terms a decade ago. Whenever the hammer price of the lot exceeds the top estimate, Sotheby's will receive an additional 2% commission.

The moves are remarkable on a number of counts.

Buyer's premium 'creep' - that brought fees to 26% and more in the London and New York salerooms - has been a familiar if controversial feature of the fine art auction business for four decades.

This is the first time since 1982 (when Christie's briefly dropped its premium from 10% to 8%) that one of the world's

leading auction houses has reduced its buyer's premium.

There is also now clear water between Sotheby's and Christie's (with its multi-tiered structure beginning at 26%) and Bonhams (a similar structure opening with a 28% fee)

The firms have broadly kept their buyers' charges in line with each other ever since buyer's fees were controversially introduced in the 1970s (previously fine art auctioneers only charged vendors' commissions).

### **Following feedback**

Sotheby's said the changes follow "consistent feedback from buyers seeking lower premiums and sellers seeking clarity on selling fees".

The auction house added: "For buyers, this new fee structure will not only make it simpler, it will also reduce the amount of buyer's premium on

the vast majority of lots. This in turn will benefit sellers by incentivising more bidding from clients which should drive up hammer prices." Sotheby's estimates that the average sold lot will incur 26% less buyer's premium than before.

As a general rule, buyer's premiums have risen so that vendor's fees can fall. Vendors of high-value items rarely pay full commission.

Sotheby's chief executive officer Charles Stewart said: "Since 1979, when Sotheby's first introduced buyer's premium in our salerooms, the market has largely shifted the transaction burden onto buyers. The result has been high costs for buyers and tiered commission structures that require a calculator to even understand, as well as an entirely opaque fee structure for sellers which distracts from what is most important to them".

Part of the reason for the sellers' changes is to move away from the private and often complex negotiations in securing works for sale. Sotheby's said it was prioritizing "transparency and simplicity" in this regard.

The changes to seller's fees do not apply to works offered with a guarantee. Such works, which the firm said now account for "the majority of Sotheby's auction business", will carry a fixed fee of 4% of the guaranteed amount, chargeable to the seller.

The new fee structure comes into effect globally on May 20. It will apply to all auctions, excluding sales of cars, real estate, wine and spirits. Consignments signed after

April 15, 2024 for auctions on or after May 20, 2024 will reflect the new terms for sellers.

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# Face off for rediscovered self portraits in NY

Two recent art market discoveries, both self-portraits by titans of 17th century British art, met contrasting fortunes in New York.

Self-Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man by Sir Peter Paul Rubens and Self-Portrait by his pupil Sir Anthony van Dyck were offered as successive lots at Sotheby's Old Masters sale on the afternoon of February I.

The van Dyck, painted in 1637-30 and thought to be the artist's penultimate self-portrait, did sell at \$2m (£1.58m) - the top Old Master price of the New York series.

The work was likely a gift to Charles I from his favourite painter and, just prior to the sale, was identified as the picture included in Abraham van der Doort's c.1639 inventory of the royal

collection. The picture later travelled with William III to Holland, where it hung in Paleis Het Loo.

These connections seem to have fallen away in the 20th century and when the picture appeared at Christie's New York in June 2006 it was sold as a later copy for just \$2600. Restoration and research supported a full re-attribution with dealer and art historian Bendor Grosvenor penning an article about the discovery in a 2016 edition of the British Art Journal. It was acquired by Sotheby's vendor on the London art market.

The Rubens came for sale almost three years after selling at Uppsala Auctions in Sweden in June 2021 for SKr5.2m (£390,000). It is thought to have been painted by Rubens in Antwerp around 1610-11, aged around 33, and had

remained in his family until 1853. However, it was unsold at Sotheby's guide of \$3m-5m.

### **Mougins museum**

Among the highlights of Christie's Classic Week was the white-glove sale of arms and armour from the Musée d'Art Classique de Mougins. The second in a series of six sales of a collection formed by commodities trader Christian Levett, it was topped at \$1m (£785,000) by an exceptionally well-preserved iron and copper alloy Weisenau type infantry helmet from the Antonine period (c.125-175AD).


The so-called Guttmann mouse helmet, derives its name from the German collector Axel Guttmann (1944-2001) who had bought it in 1993, and the enigmatic decorative motif of two mice

and a loaf of bread at the back.

Along its lower edge is a punched inscription naming the helmet's original owner as one Julius Mansuetus. Although now missing its hinged check pieces, it was sold with an associated iron dolabra, a type of pickaxe, retaining its hinged brass case for the blade.

It was part of the Guttmann collection sale at Christie's in 2004 but, as it went unsold, was later acquired from his heirs in 2013.

A Philip Webb Designed House. Philip Webb is widely acknowledged to be the 'father of Arts and Crafts architecture' - and one of the founders of the Arts and Crafts movement - a decorative and fine arts trend that developed earliest and most fully in the British Isles before spreading across the British Empire and the rest of Europe and America in the 19th Century.

His use of vernacular architecture demonstrated his commitment to "the art of common building." William Morris, Edward Burne-Jones and Dante Gabriel Rossetti were his business partners and he designed many notable buildings including one for Morris.

# Chippendale's Brocket Hall suite

Thomas Chippendale's commission for Sir Penistone Lamb, 1st Viscount Melbourne (1748 -1819) at Brocket Hall in Hertfordshire was delivered in a concentrated period from about 1772-75.

The neoclassical giltwood seat furniture he made for the Drawing Room at Brocket originally comprised 12 armchairs, 12 side chairs and four settees, which is the largest salon suite Chippendale provided for any client.

Designed specifically for entertaining royalty, the Grand Saloon project at Brocket Hall cost £1500 which equated to more than the cost of a substantial mansion at the time. James Paine, the only architect to subscribe to Chippendale's 1754 Director, oversaw the project and may have played some part in the design of the suite.

The model is an adaptation of one Chippendale used at Harewood.

Paine illustrated some of the Chippendale furnishings at Brocket in his publication Noblemen and Gentlemen's Houses of 1783. Although the property changed hands in 1922 (selling to Sir

Charles Nall-Cain), the giltwood suite remained at the house after Sir Charles bought all its elements at the five-day contents sale that followed. When Country Life photographed Brocket Hall in 1925, not only was the 28-piece suite complete, but its original crimson floral damask was still intact.

The various elements were eventually dispersed in the late 20th century. Two settees and four armchairs were sold in 1994; two settees and four more armchairs were sold in 1995; and the four remaining armchairs were sold in 1999. A pair of torcheres from Brocket Hall sold for £400,000 as part of Christie's Chippendale sale in 2018.

Dreweatts' side chairs - since regilded and reupholstered in a floral silk - were bought by the vendor as a set of four from Partridge Fine Art and later reunited with two others from the collection of Lord Weinstock, Bowden Park. They came for sale in Newbury from a London house titled the Wimpole Street collection.

### Tapestry replica bought for Bayeux

The Bayeux Museum in France has been revealed as the buyer of a lifesize Victorian replica of the Bayeux Tapestry from the Charlie Watts sale at Christie's.

The museum paid a hammer price of £16,000 (£20,160 including buyer's premium) against an estimate of £8000-12,000 on September 29.

The 1874 replica was created following a project by Joseph Cundall (1818-95) who was sent by the British government to photograph the entire Bayeux Tapestry.

It was recorded on 185 fullsize glass plates, from which six copies were made and handcoloured by students of the School of Art. London.

Of the six photographic reproductions only two other examples are still known: one in a private collection in Wales and another at the V&A.

### Write them on the beaches

Winston Churchill's desk which he used to write his Second World War memoirs has been sold by Peter Harrington Rare Books at The Winter Show in New York (January 19-28).

First-time exhibitors at the fair, the firm showcased highlights from a massive collection of Churchill's books, papers and related memorabilia. The buyer, an existing client of Peter Harrington, saw it there and snapped it up.

The 19th century George II-style mahogany pedestal desk, sold for \$450,000, featured a leather-inset rectangular top with moulded edge above three frieze drawers, restored in places. It stood for many years in the private office of his Hyde Park Gate home and he used it extensively during his post-war political career. He worked on *The Second World War* as well as his *History of the English-Speaking Peoples* during this time. Later, the office was repurposed as his personal bedroom and the desk was next to him there when he died.

According to a spokesperson for the gallery, the buyer "immediately understood its significance as the place Churchill would have worked on some of his most iconic writings, it just immediately resonated".

It was part of a collection built up by Steve Forbes starting in the 1980s

Pom Harrington, owner of Peter Harrington, said the collection "is a real testament to what a private collector can

achieve through combining multi-decade perseverance with the ability to grasp every opportunity to acquire exceptional material".

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

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





# How the flavour of times past can

Geoffrey Walton has a collection of 18th century cider and perry glasses. He has used his considerable knowledge of the items and the social background at the time they were made and used to write a book on the subject.

# ATG: How and when did you get the collecting bug?

Geoffrey Walton: It was back in the mid-1960s when I lived in Lincoln and visited the Usher Museum when my interest in Georgian glass was first stimulated.

It was also possible to buy some glasses in the local auctions in the city. At that time there were many antiques shops in and around the Lincoln area and generally more interest in antiques than there is currently.

# What drew you to glassware and 18th century drinking glasses in particular?

They are things of beauty that have a fascination being made of such fragile material. The 18th century drinking glasses like those seen in the Usher Museum always caused a stir at local auctions.

# Are these items effectively glasses decorated with engravings of fruit or were they used specifically and only for drinking cider and perry?

Many Georgian drinking glasses are decorated with images appropriate to the beverage to be consumed. Wine glasses typically had grapes and vine leaves, beer had barley sprays and sheaves with hops and

cider and perry glasses had images of apples and pears.

# How widespread was cider and perry drinking compared with beer drinking at that time?

In Georgian times drinking water was unwise unless it was drawn from deep wells away from populated and industrial areas and filtered and boiled. Little wine was produced in England so the principal beverages consumed were ale and beer.

In the late 1600s there were 1700 ale house, inns and taverns in Britain when the population was less than 4 million (one for every 230 men, women and children).

There were a few establishments that sold cider and perry, but it tended to be a localised beverage concentrated in the West Country, parts of the south coast and East Anglia where the apples and pears were grown.

Cider and perry consumption fell far behind that of beer and ale following the poisoning events at the end of the 18th century when metal contamination occurred during cider production.

Cider consumption might perhaps be roughly correlated with the number of cider glasses that I have been able to track down. The greatest number appear to have been made between 1750 and 1770.

# Who were they made for and how precisely can they be dated?

Early on in the 18th century the wealthy probably had separate sets of glasses for different types of drink. We know this from discoveries in large country houses.

The 18th century is essentially the starting point of the Industrial Revolution and changes occurred regularly in the types and images on glasses just as significant changes were also being made in the manufacture of silver and other items.

Little was stationary at a time when fashion as well as industry was innovating. Cider and perry glasses



They are things of beauty that have a fascination being made of such fragile material can be dated only approximately unless there is a particular association regarding the details engraved on the bowl. There are no known contemporary images in paintings or engravings of cider being drunk from glasses.

Generally cider and perry glasses can only be dated to the nearest decade or so; this is done by reference to the stem of the glass. Hence baluster and balustroid stems date to the 1730s and 1740s, plain and incised stems to the next decade and air and opaque twist stems to the 1750s to 1770s. Faceted stems appear on cider and perry glasses between c1770 and the end of the century.

One can be more precise with the glasses that refer to the Cider Tax that was threatened in the early 1760s and imposed between 1763 and 1766. The reason this was recorded on cider glasses was that the Cider Tax required inspectors to enter private houses for the first time to check on the cider manufacturing capacity. It was the origin of the phrase "every man's home is his castle".

Some cider glasses have images of possible Jacobite significance but that is difficult to date i.e. before, during or after 1745.

- 1. Cider glass with a bell bowl, a multi-spiral air twist stem with a top knop and a low conical foot. The bowl is engraved with two cartouches of fruiting apple branches enclosing a large apple in each cartouche. Probably made and engraved in the 1750s.
- 2. Water or beer jug with a dockside scene with three sailing ships, a winch and stores on the dock. Turquoise trailing around the rim. Probably made in north-east England in the early 19th century.
- **3**. Cider glass with a bucket bowl, plain stem and low conical foot. It is engraved with a branch of apples and leaves below the rim of the bowl. Possibly dating from the 1750s.
- **4**. Cider glass with a round funnel bowl on a multi-spiral air twist stem with top and centre knops. It has a low conical foot and the bowl is engraved with a leafy apple branch with four apples and a codling moth. It probably dates from the 1770s.
- **5**. Glass made for the drinking of cider, perry or other fruit-based beverage with an ogee bowl. It has a plain stem and a low conical foot and is engraved with three different fruit trees with their trunks and roots on the stem and foot. It is probably unique and possibly dates from the 1750's.
- **6.** Cider glass with a narrow round funnel bowl and a double spiral opaque twist stem and a steep conical foot. It is engraved with an apple tree branch with five apples, each with a distinct calix. Possibly made in the 1750s.

# Why do these items matter and what do they tell us about the period they came from?

The images on the glasses reflect the social and commercial history of cider production and the ingenuity of the engravers.

In my book I have attempted a classification of these images and include among the groupings items such as historical events, personal and political sentiments, horticultural activities, pollinators and pests, societal images (by which I mean elaborate decoration that would have meaning to the wealthy upper middle classes) and images likely to be of interest to the growing middle class.

These latter images show features relating to different beverages so there may be an engraved sheaf of barley, a bunch of grapes with vine leaves and also the branch of an apple tree.

Hence one set of glasses would suffice for all and any drink at the dinner table. The house would not require separate sets of glasses. They were still a rarefied item since the bulk of the population – the rural and industrial poor – could scarcely afford glass for their windows!

#### Where do you find items to buy?

Almost exclusively in auctions, less commonly from a few dealers. No doubt there are some that find their way onto eBay and into charity shops but I don't have time to spend trawling round these venues nor bring and buy stalls. Relatively few antiques fairs appear to have stands with Georgian glasses.

## How would you describe your collecting habit?

Highly selective and limited. There are too many other things to do in your 80s!

Are you still adding to your collection? What do you look for when considering to adding to your collection?

Yes, I do still buy items from time to time but only specialised items such as cider and perry glasses and a few ale glasses.

# What is the most you have ever spent on an item for your collection?

In the high four figures; I have not yet reached five figures.

# What makes some glasses from the period much more valuable than others?

As I indicate in the book, there are many more wine glasses than ale glasses and there are many more ale glasses than cider glasses, and perry glasses are exceedingly rare. I could track down only images of about 95 cider glasses and three perry glasses; there must be more. Scarcity affects price.

# How has the market for these items changed over the time you have built your collection?

I remember two large baluster wine glasses sold in an auction in Lincoln for £12 in the mid-1960s. There was a lot of interest then, but it appears to have subsided significantly in the last two decades.

There are now only three auction houses having periodic auctions that

include Georgian glass - Bonhams, Wooley and Wallis and Fieldings. The odd item crops up occasionally in a few other auctions but much less predictably.

# Is there a notable discovery you have made that you are particularly proud of?

Yes, it's engraved with three different fruit trees which might be apple, pear and plum. The trunks and roots are shown on the stem and foot. Tim Osborne at Delomonse thinks it may be unique.

# What is the glass you don't have in your collection that you'd love to have? Any perry glass.

# How extensive is your collection and do you ever sell items from it?

I have about 60 glasses. I have sold items, aided in the selection process by specialists who were not concerned with the sale.

# How do you store and display your collection?

I have a couple of display cabinets on the wall in my study.

# What aspect of collecting gives you most pleasure?

Finding an auction catalogue with an appropriate glass in it.

### Do you enjoy drinking cider and perry?

Not particularly. I prefer an Islay malt whisky.

#### Do you use your glasses for drinking?

Not glasses from my main collection but a whisky glass from the 19th or early 20th century is less risky – unless the volume consumed is substantial.

# Is there an extensive collecting community for these items?

There must be some since there is often much interested bidding for cider glasses in auctions.

# Is there a related club or society that you are a member of?

I am a member of the Glass Society [formed by a merger of The Glass Association and The Glass Circle in 2019]. Its remit includes historical as well as contemporary glass. It holds meetings and visits and produces a quarterly publication, *The Glass Cone*.

# Who are the specialists in your field that you particularly admire and why?

Collectors are as good as those who advise them.

The specialists I admire are Tim Osborne, Bob Marris and Peter Adamson, each of whom has advised me. I also appreciate the help that I get from the three auction houses that regularly sell Georgian drinking glasses.

It is also very useful that there are museums such as the Hereford Cider Museum and the Bristol City Museum that have archivists who are helpful and have items of great interest that may be inspected.

### Do you also collect anything else?

Yes. Like one former Conservative cabinet minister I did not inherit my furniture and furnishings and so my wife and I have had to collect/purchase many of the things in our house. That was both amusing, frustrating and interesting. I also collect items relevant to the books that I write.

# What advice would you give a young collector?

Collect what you can afford, appreciate and use.

### Why did you decide to write a book?

I am retired and have been involved in the academic and consulting worlds; report writing was not dissimilar to writing a book.

I hope the book on cider and perry glasses helps to uncover more examples of such items beyond the 100 or so that are illustrated in one place for the first time. The book also provides a useful classification of the images on the bowls of these glasses. It may be possible to publish additional images; some have already come to light as a result of initial sales. It should be of interest to collectors, dealers, archivists and auctioneers wherever cider and perry glasses crop up.

### Any more projects in the pipeline?

Yes, I am currently co-authoring a book on British Geological Sequences published in the early 19th century.



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# Fair winds and god speed for Captain Vancouver

Explorer and naval captain George Vancouver set sail from King's Lynn in April 1791 aboard HMS *Discovery* to survey the Pacific Northwest coastline of North America.

During his travels he circumnavigated the Canadian island now known as Vancouver Island, and later published his findings in the three-volume book *Voyage of Discovery to the North Pacific Ocean* (1798).

This 5in (12cm) glass beaker was probably made in King's Lynn as a souvenir of his embarkment. Alongside the central image of the three-masted *Discovery*, it is engraved with the legend *Captain George Vancouver*, *Fair Winds and God Speed*.

A rare survivor with obvious cross-over collecting appeal, it sold for £2200 at Kinghams (25/18/15% buyer's premium) in Moreton-In-Marsh, on December 7 against an estimate of £500-800.

### **Highly admired**

It was a much earlier 18th century drinking glass that, against the same guide, made £7500 at the Gloucestershire sale.

This was one of the Queen Anne heavy baluster wine glasses that are so admired by collectors. This example was a particularly pleasing form with a single air drop to the bowl and an egg-shaped tear to the stem. It sold via thesaleroom.com.

A taste of rare colour combinations



The Durrington Collection of Glass, a select 60-lot auction which **Bonhams (28/27/21/14.4% buyer's premium)** offered for sale last year on November 15, featured some of the best examples of 18th century British glassmaking across a number of collectable categories.

Choice examples of early balusters; Jacobite engraved glasses, glasses decorated in enamels by the Beilby family as well as colour tinted glasses, were all represented in this collection, purchased over many years, much of it acquired from Asprey and featuring many pieces with notable provenances. Until 2004 it was on loan to Broadfield House Museum.

As well as the rare Beilby enamelled glasses that led the auction (see *ATG* 2619 front page) colour-tinted glasses were one element that was particularly well represented here (a 1986 exhibition at Asprey of green tinted glasses, many of them from the collection of Michael Parkington, was the source for a number of pieces in the Durrington collection).

The two most expensive tinted examples in this auction were very rare glasses c.1765 which combined tinted bowls and feet (one in green the other in blue) with an opaque twist stem formation, each of which sold for a hammer price of £22,000.

The green-tinted version, which is probably from the Parkington collection, comes from a rare set of six. Others are in the Fitzwilliam Museum and the Diageo Collection while two others from the Hubbard and the Kaplan collections were sold by Bonhams in 2011 and 2017 respectively for prices of £11,000 and £18,000 and a fifth example (formerly in the Durrington collection) was sold by Christie's in 1986.

The blue tinted version is one of only three known examples, one of which is in the Fitzwilliam, the other having sold by Bonhams in 2017, also as part of the Kaplan collection, for £32,000.

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





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# 'Incredibly busy and buoyant'

North Yorkshire saleroom starts 2024 with 2600 lots offered over two weeks in four auctions

The Country House event from January 12-13 at Tennants (24% buyer's premium) numbered around 1000 lots and included several designated consignments, among them items from the Terry family of York, of chocolate fame, selected contents from Dutton Manor in Lancashire and ceramics from a collection in the Isle of Man.

But it was a different source that yielded the Leyburn sale's top-seller: a bronze animalier sculpture.

Antoine Louis Barye (1796-1875) is one of the best known and most celebrated in a long line of French animalier sculptors and his *Cheval Demi-Sang Tête Baissée* (a half-blood horse with head lowered) is a model that comes up for sale relatively regularly.

The example at Tennants, which measured 7in (17.5cm) in length and was set on a rectangular stepped base, was inscribed in gilt CLXXIII, and signed BARYE and BARYE2.

Tennants' specialist Andrew Parker had felt that the bronze, which was estimated at £500-700, was a posthumous cast but given that the bidding on sale day soared to £10,000 he said perhaps the bidders thought it might have been cast a bit earlier.

Also making far more than predicted at £5000 against an estimate of just £200-300 was a wooden icon panel measuring 2ft 2in x 20in (68 x 51cm) depicting St Margaret of Antioch and showing the saint holding a cross and a palm frond while standing on a dragon with two angels in the top corners and an inscription along the base.

Consigned by a North Yorkshire client, the cataloguing gave little other information beyond describing it as Middle Eastern school but without attribution to any date or country of origin.

Margaret of Antioch, who was born in what is now modern-day Turkey, is a saint in both western and eastern Greek orthodox Christianity and the Coptic church (although the inscription along the base of the icon looks to be in Arabic rather than Roman or Greek script). Tortured for refusing to renounce Christianity, she was swallowed by the devil in the shape of a dragon, from whom



she escaped alive when the cross she carried irritated the animal's interior.

Chinese porcelain in the sale was boosted by input from the Terry and Dutton Manor consignments.

The most expensive at £2800 was a lot containing two 19th century blue and white ginger jars both with pierced wood covers. Standing 8 and 8¼in (20 and 2lcm) high, both were painted with cracked ice and prunus grounds: one featuring panels of various precious objects, the other (which bore a label for J.R. Kidson, China Dealer, Leeds), with panels of kylin.

From the Terry family came an 8½in (22cm) diameter porcelain bowl of conical shape painted with dragons and phoenix on a cloud scroll ground. It bore a six character Chenghua reign mark but was catalogued as probably 18th century rather than from the 15th and made £2200 against a £300-500 guide

Of note among the antique furniture was an example of Killarney marquetry from the mid 19th century. This was in the form of a 2ft 5in (76cm) high fitted work table on a tapering support and base (a favoured shape for displaying this kind of Irish inlay work) and was composed of yew and arbutus wood decorated and inlaid with an oval panel of a ruined abbey to the lid as well as with scrolling trails of leaves. It made £2200 (estimate £600-800).

There was also a strong price for

a smaller example of marquetry - a 5½ in high oval 19th century tea caddy in green stained and inlaid satinwood with stained bone escutcheon and bone knops to the outer and inner cover. It easily outpaced a modest £150-200 guide to take £1200.

Another lot to exceed expectations, making £2000 against predictions of £300-500, was an 18in (46cm) high French clockwork powered singing bird automaton dated to c.1900 set in a Paris porcelain jardiniere painted with panels of figures in landscapes.

### Packed programme

The Country House sale was among a full crop of auctions at the North Yorkshire firm to kick off 2024. They also included a 900-lot-plus Antiques and Interiors sale on January 5, stamps on January 10, and a dedicated silver and jewellery auction also on the 13th.

In all, Tennants sold over 2600 lots for a total hammer price of over £838,000 in the first two weeks of the year.

"It has been an incredibly busy and buoyant start of the year, with packed viewings and strong prices achieved for our clients," said auctioneer Jane Tennant.

"We have been privileged, too, to have sold property from numerous private estates across the country, and a fantastic selection of jewellery,

watches and silver which totalled in excess of 600 lots alone".

### **Manchester races**

Punching well above its size and weight to take one of the higher prices in Tennants' January 13 sale of jewellery, watches and silver was a silver racing badge or token which was bid to £1000, a multiple of the £250-350 guide.

The oval token measuring just 2in (5cm) wide and weighing 18dwt (50grams), was marked for Isaac Simmons, Sheffield, 1846. It was engraved *Manchester New Race Course Association* on a garter and *Established 1847* while the reverse was engraved *Mr John Greenwood*.

Various venues were used for horse racing around Manchester from at least the middle of the 17th century, though none of the courses were actually in Manchester itself.

The course for which this badge is engraved was on a site near the river Irwell, Irwell Castle, which was rented on a 20-year lease from 1847-67 from the Member of Parliament and owner of the Pendleton Colliery, John Fitzgerald.

It had a 1000-seat stand which offered a view of the entire course. After the initial lease expired, Fitzgerald's son, who inherited the estate, declined to renew it and so the course was closed and moved to New Barns. Weaste.

In 1902 the land at Weaste was

acquired by the Manchester Ship Canal Co and racing moved back to Castle Irwell after the race committee purchased that land from the executors of John Fitzgerald's son.

The John Greenwood whose name is engraved on the reverse is very probably the one born in 1788 who is known for being a transport entrepreneur and keeper of a toll-gate in Pendleton on the Manchester to Liverpool turnpike.

He went on to purchase a horse and carriage to be used for an omnibus service between Pendleton and Manchester which did not require prior booking, and died in 1851 leaving a successful business to his son.

Another example of this badge, though without a name engraved on the reverse, was sold at Noonans, London, in December 2016 for £650.

#### **Regimental silver**

Included in these auctions was a collection of regimental silver sold by order of the Royal Regiment of Fusiliers to benefit the Fusiliers' Aid Society.

Among its highlights was an oversized 17¾in (45cm) claret jug and a pair of goblets made in Birmingham in 1880 by Frederick Elkington. Presented to the Second Battalion of the 20th (East Devonshire) Regiment by Lieutenant A Montgomery to mark his marriage, they sold for £2500. ■

# Butterflies signal a long life

Modestly guided at just £200-300, this tiny Qianlong period ruby-glazed teabowl and 4in (10.5cm) diameter saucer generated plenty of interest when it came up for sale at Elstob (25% buyer's premium).

Both the saucer and the teabowl are painted with a butterfly and flowers to the centre bordered by a yellow diaper ground reserved with vignettes.

Since the word for butterfly in Chinese is homophonous with one meaning repeat and similar to one meaning over 70 or 80 years, the insects are often featured in decoration in Qing dynasty porcelain to suggest a wish for longevity.

Both the saucer and teabowl, which were finely potted, were covered to the exterior in a ruby glaze with a soufflé-like texture that is probably achieved by blowing the enamel through a tube with gauze covering the end. Conditionwise, there was a hairline crack to both the bowl and saucer and some small losses to the ruby glaze on the saucer.

This piece also had the bonus of an attractive old provenance attested by a label to the underside of the teabowl indicating that it came from the PB Cooke collection and was part of the BADA Art Treasures Exhibition held at Christie's in 1932.

It ended up selling for £6800 in Ripon on January 10.

# Getting ahead as the year begins

Mallams (25% buyer's premium) got off to an early New Year start with a Country House auction.

The sale in Cheltenham on January 10 generated over £100,000.

The top lot was a carved stone lion's head measuring 11½ x 11in (29 x 28cm) approximately and thought to be Italian, dating from the 15th or 16th century.

It had come from the estate of a deceased collector and their notes recorded that reputedly the piece had been "verified by the British Museum as a Renaissance example from a wine jar or sarcophagus".


Certainly it generated more interest than the £400-600 predicted, selling finally for £4800 to a phone bidder from overseas.

Notable among the many furniture items on offer was a 4ft 5in x 22in (1.35m x 56cm) parcel gilt bevelled edge mirror fitted with two mirror plates. Its form was in the manner of the mirrors and pier glasses attributed to the 18th century London cabinet-maker John Belchier (1699-1753) whose best known commission was the furniture supplied to Erdigg in Wales.

Mallams' mirror, which had

# Mask makes 140 times the top guide

A 19th century Native American wolf mask, once used in religious ceremonies on the Northwest coast, emerged from the obscurity of a  $\pounds 50$ -100 estimate to bring £14,000 at auction in Hertfordshire.

It came for sale, seemingly with little in the way of provenance, at **Hansons Ross (26% buyer's premium)** in Royston on January 12.

Shamanic masks or headdresses made by Native Americans from the Northwest coast are among the most striking of all tribal art. Often depicting the spirit animals, they were worn during the potlatch or other important ceremonial occasions.

While most are attributed to the Haida people,

they were also made by the Tlingit and the Tsimshian in British Columbia.

This example, measuring 15in (37cm) long, is made in wood, animal hide and human hair with abalone shell inlays flashing from the eyes and the teeth.

Although it was catalogued as 'a carved wood tribal ceremonial horse's head mask', it more likely evokes a wolf and would have been used in the walas'axa or wolf dance. Probably once brightly painted when used in the 19th century, it is now in tired but unrestored condition.

# It's a shore thing

Namikawa Yasuyuki (1845-1927) is one of the most famous and highly regarded masters of the art of Japanese cloisonné.

He worked in a number of different styles over the course of his long career and this 4¼in (11cm) example decorated with a landscape featuring a shoreline view of houses against a blue ground is one of his later pieces dating from the early 20th century.

The vase was marked for Yasuyuki on the base, as shown in the detail here. Against a £2000-3000 guide it sold for £9500 at Rowley's Fine Art (22.5% buyer's premium) in Ely, Cambridgeshire, on January 13.



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# Many happy returns for Mod Brits

Canny buyers who invested in works by female artists are now reaping the rewards in salerooms

A couple of works sold at recent auctions underlined the growth in value for Modern British female artists, those that are commercially established at least.

Leading the latest sale of Modern British and Irish Art at Chiswick Auctions (25% buyer's premium) was a 1958 oil by Eileen Agar (1899-1991) titled A Sea Change. The 2ft lin x 2ft 8in (63 x 82cm) oil on canvas was bought by the vendor for £900 at Christie's sale of works from the collection of Lord Sainsbury in 1999.

Since then, the artist's curatorial and commercial standing has increased considerably, although she has long been a well-known name to followers of British Surrealism.

Agar was the subject of a show at Pallant House Gallery in Chichester in 2008-09 and examples of her work can now be found in institutions such as the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) in New York, the Peggy Guggenheim Collection in Venice and Tate Modern and the V&A in London.

In terms of her recent auction record, all of the highest prices for her painted works have come in the last two years according to data from Artprice.com, whereas a ceiling of £20,000 had existed for five years prior to that.

A record £65,000 was paid for her 1971 canvas *Rite of Spring* at Christie's in 2022

The artist was famously the only female artist to exhibit at *The International Surrealist Exhibition* held in London in 1936, but experienced a resurgence of inspiration in the 1950s when she briefly resided in the Canary Islands. *A Sea Change* is a prime example of Agar's output during this period and was a rare picture to emerge on the secondary market.

The 2ft lin x 2ft 8in (63 x 82cm) work at Chiswick's sale was executed in an inverted method, with the coloured forms probably painted across the entire composition, before being partially covered by aquamarine paint like the cut-outs from a Matisse collage.

Included in the retrospective of the artist's work held at the Commonwealth Institute in 1971,

the picture was also exhibited at the Pallant House 2008-09 show titled *Eileen Agar, An Eye for Collage.* 

Estimated at £20,000-30,000 at the December 12 sale, it attracted decent interest before the gavel fell at £26,000. The price was the 10th highest for Agar at auction but the most ever fetched at a sale outside those at Sotheby's, Christie's and Bonhams. It also represented an eyecatching return for the vendor and demonstrated the way this sector of the market can offer great opportunities for sellers, especially those operating over a timespan of a decade or more.

Another significant return for a picture bought in the 1990s came for a work on paper by Dame Paula Rego (1935-2022). Wendy and Hook III was one of her studies inspired by children's stories, in this case Peter Pan, which Rego illustrated for an edition published by The Folio Society in 1992.

The drawings and watercolours, as well as a set of 15 etchings and aquatints, that she produced focused on the psychological elements of JM Barrie's book and exemplified the artist's trademark attention to the complexities beneath the surface within stories. The original works were exhibited at a dedicated show at London's Marlborough Gallery from December 1992-January 1993 where the example here was purchased by a member of the vendor's family.

The price paid was probably a fraction of the £15,000-25,000 estimate at the Chiswick sale given the huge increases in the market for Rego's work since then. A boost came after London's Tate Britain gallery mounted a major retrospective of her work in 2021, and then the auction record for the Portuguese-British artist was smashed in October last year when a monumental pastel sold at Christie's for a cool £2.5m.

Selling at £16,000, the price set a benchmark at auction for a work from Rego's *Peter Pan* series.

Meanwhile, a strong competition developed at Hampshire saleroom Andrew Smith & Son (23% buyer's

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# Piper pops up at auction and Lowry lines up for sale

A couple of works by leading names in the sector gave a boost to Chiswick Auctions' (25% buyer's premium) latest Modern British and Irish Art sale.

A signed watercolour by John Piper (1903-92) was among the works drawing interest across the 149 lots.

Bedroom window, Carmarthen, a 21in x 2ft 3in (53 x 70cm) watercolour, gouache, chalk, ink and wash had intriguing composition even though the themes and style were highly familiar to followers of the Epsom-born artist.

Piper, who worked in a wide variety of media, had a deep interest in churches and architecture and tried to capture their sense of history and visual appeal in a Neo-Romantic artistic

The work here shows the English Baptist Church in Carmarthen, a Grade II\* listed building described as 'one of the most architecturally ambitious classical chapels in Wales'. Piper photographed the structure, a negative of which was part of the archive he presented to Tate Gallery in 1987.

Estimated at £6000-8000, it brought a good competition and sold at £19,000, an above average sum for a work on paper in this size at auction.

Also making a useful contribution to the total was an LS Lowry (1887-1976) drawing of Hulme Place in Salford, a location not far from his home in Pendlebury. The 10½ x 14½in (27 x 37cm) pencil sketch was signed

It had previously fetched £17,000 at Christie's in 2002 and was subsequently purchased by the vendor from Cheshire dealer Clark Art. Here it was pitched at



£22,000-28,000 and sold on low estimate.

A selection of Lowry drawings will also appear at North Yorkshire saleroom Tennants on March 2. The group of works were given by the artist to his clock repairer Neville Blakey.

Lowry first met Blakey in the late 1950s when the artist took a clock for repair at the latter's premises in Pendle, Lancashire. During his first visit Lowry did not reveal his identity. However, by the time he went to collect the clock Blakey had realised who he was and the pair, who had a mutual interest in horology, struck up a lasting friendship.

He visited us here ... and we made return visits on many occasions to his house at Mottram in Longdendale. He was a most kind person..."

The estimate is £4000-6000. Also included with the lots is a small archive of correspondence between Lowry and Blakey, including copies of letters written

to Lowry, and signed letters from


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

### premium) for an elegant still-life by Diana Maxwell Armfield (b.1920).

The artist has had a long and varied career, working as a painter, designer and teacher, but her commercial standing on the secondary market has never been as prominent as many of her contemporaries.

This is partly due to the fact that most of her painted works are small canvases which, in terms of artistic approach, usually followed earlier styles as she was influenced by artists such as Pierre Bonnard and Walter

Before turning to painting full time in 1965, she worked as a designer and ran the textiles and wallpaper partnership Armfield-Passano (the firm displayed a



number of designs at the 1951 Festival of Britain).

Examples of her fabrics and furnishings can now be found in

the Victoria and Albert Museum collection.

Although a member of a number artistic groups and societies, and

exhibiting at well-established dealers such as Browse & Darby, it was not until 1991 when she was in her 70s that she was elected to the Royal

The work at the Alresford auction on December 12-13 was one of those she exhibited at the RA Summer Exhibition that same year. Titled April flowers on the sill, Llwynhir, the 11 x 8in (28 x 21cm) oil on board was signed with initials and was painted in north Wales, where she and her husband and fellow RA Bernard Dunstan had a cottage.

A number of still-lifes by Armfield attracted decent interest in 2023. One made a top-estimate £3000 at Dreweatts in January last year, which was followed by another going over predictions at Bellmans in May at £2200.

The painting at Andrew Smith drew the best contest of the lot.

Pitched at £300-500, it attracted several bidders and was eventually knocked down at £4200. The sum was the second highest for the artist at auction, standing only behind a painting of a cat sold for £5500 at Sotheby's in 2007. ■

# Betjeman: the personal connection

Gifts given by the late Poet Laureate to his friend show how interesting items can be bought for three figures

When the noted cinematographer John McGlashan died aged 86 in 2021, he left behind him a body of work spanning 60 years and encompassing major dramas, TV shows and documentaries.

As resident cameraman on the long-running arts programme *Monitor*, he worked with directors such as Ken Russell, John Schlesinger and Ken Loach, and shot classics as varied as the landmark documentary *The Ascent of Man* (1973) and TV shows such as *Porridge* and *Doctor Who.* 

His family consigned personal gifts from one of his favourite TV personalities, the late Poet Laureate Sir John Betjeman, to the January 23 book sale at John Nicholson's (25% buyer's premium) of Fernhurst.

Estimated at £300-500, a group of presentation copies sold for £440.

### Firm friends


The pair became friends when they worked together on some of the poet's documentaries, famed for their gentle whimsy and personal approach: *Metro-Land* (1973), *A Passion for Churches* (1974) and the poet's childhood autobiography in verse *Summoned by Bells* (1976).


The strength of that friendship can be seen in the inscriptions written by Sir John in the copies of his works that he presented to the BAFTAnominated McGlashan, offered for sale for the first time.


Sir John's self-deprecating charm is evident in a signed and annotated cover for the audio reading of his verse collection *Banana Blush*. Inscribed *Oh that I had more hair!*, it follows a series of arrows to a photograph of the poet on which he has added a spiky hairdo to his bald pate.

A copy of the Collins Guide to English Parish Churches, edited by Sir John, carries an inscription dated to 1972, on a hot July day at Waddesdon, Bucks. Page 103 of the book carries a typically farcical Betjeman addition: a circular stain annotated: Gin spilt by John Betjeman... Waddesdon 6/7/72. The poet's spidery handwriting was notoriously difficult to read and part of the remaining inscription is indecipherable.

The men's shared humour is

a copy of a first edition of Betjeman's book London's Historic Railway Stations, in which he writes: John McGlashan Horn Captain, for good service to the Horn, John Betjeman 1972 Front Row Shoot. Betjeman has added his City of London address for Cloth Fair and phone number.

further evident in an inscription on

The facing inside cover carries the poet's elaborate bookplate for *Four* 

Essays on West Country Churches.

The Betjeman lot featured various other signed and inscribed copies of the poet's works all presented as personal gifts to McGlashan, while other items consigned from the same source included signed and inscribed works by Dame Freya Stark, Molly Keane, Sir Laurens van der Post, Jacob Bronowski (with whom he made *The Ascent of Man*) and

Betjeman's wife, Penelope Chetwode.

Another lot comprised a signed and inscribed copy of *Rabbit is Rich*, a novel from the famous series by John Updike, who died on December 30. Updike writes: For John McGlashan my very own cameraman with esteem and warm regards, John Updike.

Six of the McGlashan items offered individually but unconnected to Betjeman took £35-55 each, but the signed and inscribed copy of Stark's A Peak in Darien made £280, as did Himalayas. Abode of Light, 1947, by Nicholas Roerich.

"This cache of books with very personal tributes to John McGlashan is a treasure trove of friendships made during the making of some of the most remarkable programmes of the past 50 years and more," said Ian Marr, books specialist at John Nicholson's.

#### Dickens on song

A four-figure highlight at the auction came in the form of an 1843 first edition of Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*.

The novella was originally published by Chapman & Hall under the longer title of A Christmas Carol. In Prose. Being a Ghost Story of Christmas. First published on December 19, 1843, just six weeks after Dickens began writing it, the book had sold out by Christmas Eve and had been through 13 editions by the end of 1844.

Estimated at £600-1000, this copy in the original gilt and blind stamped brown cloth binding, with some damage – to the spine, for example – made £5500.

Marr said: "This was a strong price for such a landmark work, bearing in mind the wear and tear."

It was sold together with a later issue (with yellow end papers not green, 'Stave I' corrected to 'Stave One' and three plates only, not four).

In January 2021 Freeman's of Philadelphia sold a first-issue copy of *A Christmas Carol* for \$16,000 (£14,545), while another first-issue copy sold for £8500 in November 18 that year in Forum's sale of books from the Rugby School Library.

Three have brought six-figure bids. In October 2010 at Sotheby's, a copy that Dickens inscribed for his great friend, the actor and stage manager William Macready, made a record £150.000.

# Comics make heroic prices in a super sell-out US auction

Heritage Auctions' 1170-lot Comics & Comic Art sale held on January 11-14 delivered a white-glove result.

More than 5500 bidders worldwide racked up a premiuminclusive \$20,338,429 sale total and set a number of records – thanks to scarce highest-graded examples of key titles.

One of only two copies of *The Amazing Spider-Man* No 1, graded CGC Near Mint/Mint 9.8, achieved a new high of a premiuminclusive \$1.38m (£1.09m).

The comic book, which hit newsstands in March 1963, just seven months after Peter Parker and his web-slinging alter-ego debuted in *Amazing Fantasy* No 15, was making its first auction appearance at Heritage.

The Dallas firm said: "This landmark book came from CGC's Curator Pedigree and sold for nearly three times the amount realised by the CGC Near Mint+ 9.6 copy that sold in July 2023 for \$520,380."

Meanwhile, one of only two copies

of Superman No I graded Fine/Very Fine 7.0 took a premiuminclusive \$2.34m (£1.85m) at

A bidding battle over the single highest-graded copy of 1942's *All Star Comics* No 8, featuring the debut of Wonder Woman, drove its final price to a premium-inclusive \$1.5m (£1.19m).

Kicking off the Silver Age of comics was 1956's *Showcase* No 4, which introduced Barry Allen's Flash. A bidding war helped this book graded Near Mint+ 9.6 race to its final premium-inclusive price of \$900,000 (£711,000), smashing the previous high of \$179,250.

Not far behind was the world's highest-graded copy of *The Brave* and the Bold No 28, in which the Justice League of America debuted. Heritage billed it as a "stunning Near Mint+ copy" and it realised a record-setting \$810,000 (£639.900).

The "nicest copy of *Incredible Hulk* No 1 Heritage has ever offered", a CGC Near Mint- 9.2 example, took an auction record of \$825,000 (£651,750). And a *Silver Surfer* No 1 from the Boston Pedigree, graded CGC Near Mint/Mint 9.8, hit a new record of \$132,000 (£104,280).

### Pulp appeal

Comics had company in this extensive sale. Heritage has offered but a handful of copies of the October 1912 All-Story, in which Edgar Rice Burroughs introduced readers to 'Tarzan King of the Jungle'. The copy in this auction, the "finest unrestored copy Heritage has ever offered", sold for a premium-inclusive \$264,000 (£208,560), "shattering a pulp record once held by The Shadow".

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

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More widely known for his uncoloured aquatints *Twenty Views of India*, Captain Elisha Traupaud was a soldier, draughtsman, engineer, and amateur actor, who joined the East India Company between 1776 and 1778. His watercolours are a rare visual testimony of his travels, which are held in institutions such as the British Library and the India Office Library in London. This group of four views of Sri Lanka, three titled *Trincomalee, Woodacottah and Columbo* are signed and dated 1803. As part of the Old Master, British and European Art sale at Dreweatts in Newbury on February 21, they are estimated at £4000-6000.


According to Mark Quayle of Noonans, Brigadier Sir Mark 'Honker' Henniker's "finest hour came when he masterminded the daring night-time rescue of the beleaguered remnants of the British 1st Airborne Division from Arnhem in September 1944".

The Mayfair auction house is offering a group of 12 medals awarded to Henniker, one of the founders of the division, on February 14 estimated at £60,000-80,000, consigned by family.

As the first Chief Royal Engineer, 1st Airborne Division, Henniker was integral to the planning of the Bruneval Raid, February 1942, and the attempted destruction of the Heavy Water Production Plant at Telemark, Norway, in November the same year. He helped plan the airborne element of the invasion of Sicily (Operation Husky) and took part in the airborne landings by glider as part of HQ 1st Airlanding Brigade, in July 1943.

He was responsible for the planning and execution of Operation Berlin: the night-time evacuation of the remnants of the beleaguered 1st Airborne Division under Roy Urquhart, trapped in German-occupied territory just west of Arnhem.

# French fancy in flurry of fair sales

Buyers slow to commit but sales continue at Mayfair antiques event

by Frances Allitt

A bronze heron by French sculptor Auguste Cain was among the sales made at *The Mayfair Antiques & Fine Art Fair*, the first major London antiques fair of the year. The piece, a classic work by Cain who specialised in avian sculptures, was offered by Garret & Hurst for £2400.

The piece was one of a number of sales made at the fair which ran from January 11-14 at the London Marriott Hotel Grosvenor Square. Kicking off the year for *Antiques Dealers Fair Limited* and its director Ingrid Nilson, it won the usual acclaim from exhibitors for organisation and running.

Margaret Cowley of Garret & Hurst said that since they have stood at the fair "I have never had as many people really seriously interested in our pieces". One attendee returned for his first fair since the pandemic after receiving a ticket from the sculpture specialist. Enthused by the experience, he decided to head for the Decorative Antiques and Textiles Fair in Battersea later that month (review to follow in future issue).

Better still was the report from glass specialist Mark West who said that the first day "was the best day we have ever had and I have done a lot of fairs". Among his sales was a quantity of 18th century glass priced around £200-600. One item sold for £800.

Other sales across the fair included a 1970s silver gilt octopus bangle from the stand of **Sue Brown** which sold over the phone to a woman in Florida who had seen it in the fair publicity. She made the purchase after seeing it modelled – by fair director Ingrid Nilson.

Jeroen Markies Art Deco, meanwhile, sold a pair of Fuji Meibo Second World War naval binoculars ticketed at £8900, a Heal's side table priced at £2200 and a pair of Harry & Lou Epstein cloud chairs offered also for £2200.

### Sophisticated printing

Elsewhere at the fair, art dealer Simon Hearnden of Berlin Walls Gallery dubbed it an "excellent fair," selling every day. Among several returning clients was a new customer who bought a large





I have never had as many people really seriously interested in our pieces woodblock print by the German artist Helmut Göring (who used to disguise his signature), which was ticketed at £1900. Hearnden said the woodblock print was "produced to demonstrate woodblock printing to the artist's students. It is quite sophisticated as he wouldn't usually have used two colours".

On the other hand, despite attracting a good selection of visitors, clients were described generally as interested but reluctant to commit. Doubtless there is an air of uncertainty hanging over the whole market at the minute. As a rule, the more uncertain the times economically and politically, the slower the sales of art and antiques.

But for some exhibitors, this fair proved better than other recent events beset by the same problems. Clock specialist Richard Price was among that number, selling well in the early days of the fair and more than covering his costs.

The next ADFL fair is *The Petworth Park Antiques & Fine Art Fair*, which runs from May 17-19. ■



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# Ultimate example of nepotism

Biennais bronzes portrayed Napoleon and the many family members he appointed to poweful positions

Spotted in a regular 'Thursday Morning at Stair' sale in upstate New York, a trio of French Empire gilt bronzes by Martin-Guillaume Biennais sold way above expectations on January 15.

After just six muscular bids they hammered for \$40,000 (£31,500) against an estimate of \$800-1200.

The Stair Galleries (23% buyer's premium) cataloguing was brief but, as indicted by the engraved signatures to the bases reading Biennais Orfre de LL MM Imp et Roi a Paris, these were made in the workshop of the imperial goldsmith and bronzier Martin-Guillaume Biennais (1764-1843).

He took advantage of the abolition of the guild system during the Revolution to build a business 'at the sign of the Singe Violet' in Paris that at its Napoleonic peak employed some 200 craftsmen making luxury goods of all kinds.

Although offered as a garniture, the models are part of a set of 28 different ormolu busts known as the *Napoleonides*. Made c.1808-10, each features a different member of the Napoleonic family raised on a crested square section or cylindrical plinth.

They may have been made as diplomatic gifts and distributed in the territories where Napoleon – the

ultimate nepotist – had given his family positions of great power.

The two persons depicted here are Napoleon himself (seen to the right) and his youngest brother Jerome Bonaparte (1784-1860), king of Westphalia from 1807-13, whose head and shoulders top both the plinth to the left and the clock case.

Busts from the Biennais

Napoleonides series make occasional saleroom appearances, most frequently in France where they can sell for upwards of €10,000 depending on subject matter.

Some of the models are known in only small numbers. Only six depictions of Caroline Bonaparte, queen of Naples, are recorded, one of which sold at Ivoire in Paris in January 2022 for €40,000.

The 12in (30cm) clock case, with movement by Henri Fort of Paris, is particularly scarce.

No other examples have been offered at auction in recent memory although another with the bust of Pauline Bonaparte, Princess Borghese, is in the collection of the Fondation Napoléon in Paris. ■



# Bereny poster: a good little burner

An original version of one of the great Art Deco posters emerged at **Sapphire Auction Gallery (20% buyer's premium)**.

The full-size 4ft 1in x 3ft 4in (1.25m x 94cm), Budapest printing of Robert Bereny's poster for Modiano cigarettes was estimated at \$100-200 on January 13 in Newark, Delaware, but hammered for \$13,000 (£10,250) to a buyer using LiveAuctioneers.

Modiano's campaign to capture the tobacco market in Hungary was famously successful.

It was the brainchild of Sokrates Stavropulos, a Greek art connoisseur who was head of advertising for the Hungarian subsidiary of the Italian firm. From 1924-30 he helped Modiano secure a market share of 80%.

Blanketing the entire country with striking posters by avant garde artists was key to

pushing the brand, with Bereny's 1929 design featuring the diagonal image of a dandy sporting top hat, monocle and cigarette, the most memorable.

Admired then and now well beyond eastern Europe, the image was chosen as the rear cover illustration to *The Art Deco Poster* by William Crouse (2013).

#### **Period pointer**

There are many modern printings of this poster but the example at Sapphire, now backed on linen and in decent condition, had the identification points of a period lithograph.

They seldom appear on the market, although in 2015 Christie's sold another of the same size with the condition grade B for  $\pounds 30,000$ .

# Cranach 'copies from 19th century' carry their own value

Among the most contested lots at Nadeau's (23% buyer's premium) sale on January I was a set of miniature watercolour and gouache portraits credited to a follower of the German court painter Lucas Cranach the Elder (1472-1553. Once thought to be 16th century period, they are now dated to the 19th century.

Nonetheless, estimated at \$3000-5000, they hammered for \$47,500 (£37,300) in Windsor, Connecticut.

The subjects, mounted in two carved giltwood frames measuring 8 x 12in (20.5 x 30.5cm), are familiar images from the Cranach oeuvre.

Two of the portraits depicted the reforming theologians Martin Luther and John Calvin and two Johann the Constant and Johann the Steadfast, electors of Saxony and important figures in the early Lutheran church.

Cranach and his workshop produced many formulaic printed and painted portraits of the subjects with whom the artist was well acquainted. However, they were also much copied in the Victorian era.





This quartet (one signed upper right and dated 1543) carried a label to one of the frames for a Christie's sale of the collection of Lord Michelham – a reference to Herbert Stern, 1st Baron Michelham (1851-1919).

A British financier, philanthropist and a member of the Stern banking family, his spectacular homes in London and Paris were filled with an impressive collection of works of art. As big spenders, Michelham and his wife, Geraldine (1882-1927), enjoyed a privileged relationship with the art dealer Joseph Duveen.

Two contents auctions were held by Christie's after Michelham's death: a sale at Strawberry Hill House in May 1926 and another at 20 Arlington Street, London, in November 1926. These pictures could have been part of one of these sales

# Shaving mugs attract top prices from foam bidders

A staple at American barber shops of the 19th and early 20th centuries was the occupational shaving mug.

Made from French or German porcelain blanks, these were locally named in gilt and embellished with polychrome enamel scenes to reflect a customer's profession or hobby. They were sold at the time for between 50 cents and \$2.50 each and stored on a wall-rack at the barber's shop awaiting the patron's next 10 cent shave.

Some of these can today bring remarkable sums.

The December 18-19 sale at Morphy's (23% buyer's premium) in Denver, Pennsylvania, included more than 200 mugs apportioned into 180 lots. Although most portraying mainstream occupations and pastimes sell for \$100-500, others depicting more unusual professions and sports command a premium.

Particularly sought-after here was a mug decorated with an image of an early racecar c.1910 together with the gilt lettered name *Seeley J Benedict* sold at \$6000 (£4700) and another of a similar date with a detailed image of a man operating single-propelled airplane with the name *William Diehl Jr* which hammered for \$5000 (£3900).

Other rarities – typically madeto-order pieces rather than those that could be bought off-the-shelf – included a mug with a deep-sea diver





alongside the name *John Dodd* and an image of a horse tied prostrate on a bench awaiting the care of veterinarian *RG Holland*. These sold at \$4400 (£3450) and \$7000 (£5500) respectively.

At the very height of the collecting hobby was the \$19,000 (£14,900) mug depicting a horse-drawn ambulance and driver with the name





C McNulty in fancy gilt lettering. It was estimated at of \$300-600 but this is a well-known design of which only two or three are recorded.

Another version of this mug labelled for *Louis Gardner* sold for \$29,000 at Yoder Auctions in Wisconsin in February 2008, a sale where a one-of-a-kind mug of a parachutist flew to \$45,000 - an

auction record for any occupational shaving mug.

#### **Amphora selection**

From a selection of 28 pieces of Amphora earthenware offered at Morphy's, a rare c.1902 vase took a bite out of its estimate.

A piece known from Byron Vreeland's collecting guide Monsters and Maidens: Amphora Pottery of the Art Nouveau Era, the 16½in vase in green and gold earth tones depicts a detailed crocodile with its mouth agape and tail wrapped around the vessel's wide base. In mint condition, the rare form sold for a hefty \$26,000 (£20,400) against an estimate of \$15,000-20,000.

Another prized Amphora vase, with two sculpted, red-glazed starfish applied to its body, guided at \$2500-3500, made \$14,000 (£11,000).

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# Dealer's taste was a cut above

An 18th century Native American trade axe pipe linked to the great Shawnee chief and warrior Tecumseh (1768-1813) was the runaway performer when the collection of Ohio dealer and entrepreneur Bruce Knight was dispersed in the first days of the New Year.

The two-day sale was conducted from January 5-6 in Delaware, Ohio under the banner of local auctioneer and appraiser Amelia Jeffers (20% buyer's premium).

Distinctive for its German silver and brass inlay and curly maple handle, this tomahawk pipe - an ingenious combination of weapon and smoking pipe used in trade and diplomatic agreements between the white settlers and the Native tribes - is thought to have been taken from Tecumseh during a council meeting in Springfield, Ohio, on June 24, 1807. The episode is related in John Sugden's biography Tecumseh, A Life (1998).

Tecumseh, born at a time when the far-flung Shawnees were reuniting in their Ohio homeland, promoted resistance to the western expansion of the US. On the basis that 'your enemy's enemy is your friend', he died fighting for the British in the War of 1812 at the Battle of the Thames on October 5, 1813.

This was a piece of some personal significance to Bruce Knight. While a young dealer in the late 1960s he had bought it from a home in Springfield, sold it quickly to another dealer and had to wait until 2002 to buy it back. This time out it had an estimate of \$2500-3500 but hammered for \$41,000 (£32,300).

Knight was the man who put Springfield on the antiques map. He founded the Springfield Antique Show

and Flea Market, which became one of the largest of its kind in the country. and the Heart of Ohio antiques centre that is still the biggest in the US.

#### **British folk connection**

Most categories of folk art were represented in the Knight collection. It included, for example, more than 20 pieces of early 19th century English mocha ware. Several choice pieces brought four-figure sums with a 7in cider jug hammering for \$6250 (£4920), close to double the top estimate. The decoration included a central band of iron red with a sliptrailed stylised tulip.

Also popular was a simple child's mug with the name Ann to a deep tan band and a jug with bands of decoration including earthworm and cat's eye. They took \$2400 (£1900) and \$1800 (£1400) respectively.

A group of 19th century British livestock oils featured three canvases by or attributed to the Worcestershire painter Richard Whitford (fl.1854-87). All had been bought by Knight at auctions held by Leominster firm Brightwells and its former incarnation Russell, Baldwin & Bright.

Based primarily in the Cotswolds, many of Whitford's pictures are of sheep. He seems to have travelled to the annual livestock shows all over the country, often painting the local gentry standing proudly beside their prize-winning animals. Offered here at \$8000-12,000 and sold at \$14,000 (£11,000) was a 2ft lin x 2ft 6in depiction of three sheep in a pasture dated 1863 and titled 1st Prize & Silver Medal, London, Xmas, 1862.

A slightly smaller portrait of a prize bull, unsigned by but attributed

to Whitford, hammered for \$9000 (£7100) against an estimate of \$1000-1500 despite some patched repairs. The composition showed

the prize beast standing four-square near a lake with a sailboat in the background.

# Early diving helmet surfaces in Kansas

Nation's Attic (20% buyer's premium) in Wichita, Kansas, is the leading US auction house for vintage diving equipment, so when an elderly widow approached them about liquidating her late husband's collection, they knew they had something special.

This helmet carries no identifying marks but dates from the 1860s or 1870s - just a matter of decades after the German instrument-maker Augustus Siebe issued his 'Siebe Improved Diving Dress' in 1840. The skilful soldering of copper and the use of convex glass suggests it was the creation of diving pioneer John Date in Montreal or possibly the Siebe Gorman firm in London.

The late collector had found the helmet with a stash of other vintage diving equipment in North Carolina. He purchased the entire lot decades ago, and the helmet was never shown or shared with the diving community.

When the lot came up for bidding, it immediately jumped above its \$10,000-20,000 estimate and kept climbing until it hammered at \$45,000 (£35,500) to a bidder using LiveAuctioneers.

Date, a master coppersmith and brass founder, established his workshop in 1853 making most of his helmets to order.





# International US hammer highlights

# American tazza was designed by a Dane

A rare silver and turquoise tazza designed by Danish silversmith Erik Magnussen (1884-1961) for the Gorham Manufacturing Company sold for \$24,000 (£19,000) at **Schwenke Auctioneers (29/27% buyer's premium)** in Woodbury, Connecticut.

Magnussen worked for Gorham as artistic director for only a short time just before the Depression after emigrating to the US in 1925.

This 75oz footed bowl, marked Gorham alongside

Magnussen's monogram, assumes a hand-hammered 16in (40.5cm) petal form supported by a cylindrical base and four spherical feet of turquoise.

A marriage of Danish Arts & Crafts and the Art Deco style, it is typical of the innovative mixed media designs that helped reinvigorate Gorham's domestic silver line in the late 1920s but ultimately sold poorly.

This piece, part of a group of silver items from a New England educational institution (it had a

scratched accession date 09/27/89 to the base) is one of only a handful of examples of its type. The estimate on December 12 was \$3000-5000.

After disappointing sales, Magnussen left Gorham shortly before the Wall Street Crash in 1929 to work for the New York branch of the German firm August Dingeldein & Sohn.

In 1932 he set up on his own, working first in Chicago and then in Los Angeles.

# Firm known for cameras also created this work of art

The Victorian artist's box, an essential accessory for any 19th century amateur, doesn't get much better than this example sold for \$5000 (£4000) at Briggs Auction Co (28% buyer's premium) in Garnet Valley, Pennsylvania, on December 8.

Made by Parisian luxury goods firm Maison Giroux, the rosewood and brass case (with locks marked Alph. Giroux et Cie. a Paris) opens to reveal both series of silver-plated wells, pigment bottles and mixing bowls plus a full complement of gold-inlaid drawing aids, knives and brushes.

Inlaid to the lids with the imperial crown of Russia, the box is understood to have been a gift in 1875 from Polish-Lithuanian nobleman Duke Radziwill to the

Grand Duchess Olga Nikolaevna (1822-92), the daughter of Tsar Nicholas II and Charlotte of Prussia. It was more recently owned by Tammis Day, the granddaughter of oil magnate William Myron Keck, and had sold as part of her estate by John Moran in Monrovia, California, in 2017 for \$4750.

Maison Giroux, founded by the art restorer and ébéniste François-Simon-Alphonse Giroux at the end of the 18th century, was based first at Rue du Coq-Saint-Honoré and, after 1857, at Boulevard des Capucines.

The firm is best known as the maker of the first commercially manufactured photographic camera: Giroux was the brother-in-law of Louis Daguerre and agreed to manufacture and retail his curious new device in 1839.

# Argentinian artist Demarco's world is full of kinetic energy

The top lot at Leonard Auction's (25% buyer's premium) December 10 sale in Addison, Illinois, was a work by the Argentinian Op artist Hugo Rodolfo Demarco (1932-95).

His 14 x 14in (35.5 x 35.5cm) sculpture *Relief Dinamic* had an estimate of \$1000-1500 but hammered for \$18,000 (£14.250).

Key to its appeal was the date – it was signed and dated 1962/65 – shortly after Demarco had left his native Buenos Aires to join the French art scene. Arriving in Paris in 1960, he had become

a founding member of the Groupe de Recherche d'Art Visuel (GRAV), the collaborative artists group in Paris that consisted of 11 opto-kinetic artists.

Relief Dinamic also carried labels for Galerie Denise Rene, the Parisian gallery that is considered the 'home' of constructive and kinetic art. It held the first exhibition *Tendencies of Abstract Art* in 1948

The mixed-media work, that would originally have been illuminated and set in motion by electricity, came for sale from a Chicago estate.

As you would imagine, Weir-Hughes is an avid collector of ephemera but his primary interest is certainly niche. "My passion is specifically airline menus and onboard food and beverage-related items" he told ATG. "My focus is on ephemera as research data, rather than just as pretty pieces. In retirement from the NHS and

academia I studied historical research methods at Oxford and food history at Edinburgh in order to help me get a grip on this area. A book is in the offing."

The prize in Weir-Hughes' collection is apparently an early Iraqi Airways Vickers Viscount menu used on flights to Vienna from Baghdad in the mid-1950s. "The route, the food and the drinks choices were all incredibly enlightening and just from one little menu," he says. It formed the basis of an article in *The Ephemerist*, the society's magazine to which Weir-Hughes is a regular contributor. More news on the society's fairs offering is due soon.

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

# Do you know where this Fortezza plate is?

I am in search of a 16th century brass parade plate by the goldsmith Oratio or Horatio Fortezza who was born in around 1530 in Sebenico, Dalmatia, then part of the Venetian Republic, now Šibenik in Croatia where he died in May 1596. This September the City museum of Šibenik is preparing the first comprehensive exhibition of his work and it would be a triumph to include some missing pieces in his small opus. His signed brass engraved dishes and ewers are in the collections of the British Museum, and the Victoria and

Albert Museum in London, the Bargello Museum in Florence, the Museo Correr in Venice and the City museum in Šibenik.

The dish we are searching for is known only from a Sotheby's sale catalogue on the 17th of July 1936, lot 70. From the description and illustration we can see that it is signed: ORATIO FORTEZZA DA SEBENICO FECE on a scroll of a cartouche above the medallion with two linked shields. In one is the arms of the well-known patrician Venetian family



Michiel (or Michiele) and in the other a Doge's ceremonial hat. It is entirely engraved with portraits of Roman emperors and scenes from Roman history and mythology on a ground of scrolling strapwork and military trophies. The diameter is 18 1/2 inches.

It is possible that there is another dish which is also Fortezza's work. It was offered to the Victoria and Albert Museum in 1951, prior to the sale of the Cook Collection but the offer was not taken up. We do not have an image, but this dish is also engraved with Roman battles and scrolling strapwork. We would also like to track this down.
